Dear J. Ader:

The Chicago Police Department (CPD) is in receipt of your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, received on December 11, 2020 for the following:

*"To Whom It May Concern:*

*Pursuant to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act, I hereby request the following records:*

*All documentation regarding Elucd products (<https://elucd.com/>) - including, but not limited to, the following:*

- Initial Bid Documents*
- Current and previous contracts with Elucd*
- Requests for Proposals*
- Bills or invoices*
- Memorandum(s) of Understanding*
- Any privacy impact assessments*
- Any instructional materials or presentations*
- Use policies and standard operating procedures*
- Data retention policies*
- Letters of Interest*
- Usage policies*
- Any informal agreements that reference "Elucd" or otherwise guide its use or the relationship between this agency and the provider or developer of the software.*

As permitted by Section 5 ILCS 140/3(e) of the Act, the time was extended in order to conduct a thorough search for these records. Your request was reviewed by the undersigned in collaboration with the Department's Finance Division. A search of CPD records was conducted utilizing the provided search parameters. CPD is providing you with the enclosed contract with Elucd.

Please be advised that certain information has been redacted from the enclosed responsive records pursuant to 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(b). Details of the redactions are set forth below.

Section 7(1)(b) exempts from disclosure “[p]rivate information, unless disclosure is required by another provision of this Act, a State or federal law or a court order.” 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(b). The FOIA, in 5 ILCS 140/2(c-5), defines “private information” as follows:

"Private information' means unique identifiers, including a person's social security number, driver's license number, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, personal financial information, passwords or other access codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, and personal email addresses. Private information also includes home address and personal license plates, except as otherwise provided by law or when compiled without possibility of attribution to any person."

Therefore, email addresses, personal telephone numbers, IP addresses, signatures, are exempt and were properly redacted pursuant to Section 7(1)(b).

You have the right to have a denial reviewed by the Public Access Counselor (PAC) at the Office of the Illinois Attorney General, 500 S. 2nd Street, Springfield, Illinois 62706, (877) 299-3642. You also have the right to seek judicial review of your denial by filing a lawsuit in Cook County Circuit Court.
