Forecast - 48 Hour Outlook:

Today: A slight chance of showers between 1300 and 1400, then a chance of showers and thunderstorms after 1400. Increasing clouds, with a high near 61. Breezy, with a west wind 10 to 15 mph increasing to 15 to 20 mph in the afternoon. Winds could gust as high as 30 mph. Chance of precipitation is 40%.

Border News:

- For the week ending **September 30, 2023**, according to the weekly DHS report, **3,245** noncitizens provided an intended destination of Chicagoland, up from **2,753** last week.
- The EOC had received intelligence that primarily singles are traveling to Chicago from the Southern Border, whereas previously family member was the majority. Philadelphia and New York said they are seeing the same trend.

- The EOC has received information that Val Verde Border Humanitarian Coalition (VVBHC) located in Del Rio, has decided to opt of the State sponsored bus program so they won't be sending any buses for the time being.
- The Biden administration will restart deporting Venezuelans directly to Venezuela in an attempt to curb the record influx of crossings at the US-Mexico border, according to senior administration officials, marking a major shift in policy. Venezuelans who cross the US-Mexico border unlawfully and lack a legal basis to remain in the United States will be eligible for removal, the senior administration officials said on Thursday, adding that Venezuela had agreed to accept back its nationals. Situational Awareness:

- **New York:**
 - Mayor Adams' administration would be barred from putting time limits on how long migrants can stay in city shelters under a new bill introduced in the NY City Council on Thursday. The legislation, penned by Brooklyn Councilwoman Shahana Hanif, a progressive Democrat who chairs the Council's Immigration Committee, aims to make the Adams administration's 30-day notice policy unenforceable. NYC Council bill would ban Adams admin from limiting how long migrants can stay in shelters (nydailynews.com)
 - New York City is challenging the legal agreement that requires it to provide emergency housing to anyone who asks for it, as the city's shelter system strains under a large influx of international migrants who have arrived since last year. The city filed a request late Tuesday, 5 OCT asking a court to allow it to suspend the requirement when there is a state of emergency where the shelter population of single adults increases at a rapid rate.
 - New York City Mayor Eric Adams told reporters in Mexico that "there is no more room in New York," as he continues his Latin America tour in hopes of discouraging migrants from heading north to the Big Apple.

 - 017 District: 9 OCT 2023, Constuction
 - Constriction work in front of 017th District. It appears that the city is going to be ripping up the curbs in front of the station and putting in new curbs and light poles. They came out today and cut some cement and marked up the curbs and sidewalk and left. They said they are

- beginning Monday, and it is expected to last 3 months This is going to cause issues with our overcrowding of migrants in front of the station.
- 012 District: 5 OCT 2023, Other
 - A migrant was taken into custody for shoplifting when a liquor store manager accused him of taking a \$1000 bottle of whiskey. [REDACTED] Store manager provided receipt to investigating officers and displayed a bottle of whiskey he said was recovered. In the course of processing, the store manager changed his story and said [REDACTED] did not take the bottle, but an accomplice did, and [REDACTED] was a diversion. The manager stated the stolen bottle was not recovered, and that the bottle originally presented to the investigating officers was not in fact, the stolen bottle. Based on the credibility of the manager and the changing story, WOL Coleman instructed the investigating officers to release migrant without charging. Moments after departing the 012th District, the same individual went to the migrant tent area located to the immediate south of the 012th District. There, an unknown offender, dressed in all black, struck him in the left arm with an empty liquor bottle. He sustained a serious laceration to his forearm. CFD Ambulance #65 responded to 012 and took him to UIC Hospital. He is a registered temporary resident of the 012th District.
 - 001 District: Other
 - The migrants have broken the wall plate that was placed on the outlet located inside the men's bathroom by the CAPS office.
 - 011 District: Other
 - Tonight was pouring rain and due to the limited overhead cover the migrants were allowed to seek cover across the street. This decision was made to avoid the migrants from coming inside the station with all their belonging. We do not have enough room in the lobby area. We posted an additional station security to monitor and secure the lot. This exception was made due to the number of migrants, limited overhead cover and tonight's pouring rain. 011 will ensure that the migrants move at 6am prior to the motor vehicle maintenance personnel returning to work. 2nd Watch will attempt to facilitate relocation through city service due to the limited space in 011.
 - 004/022: 3 OCT 2023, Other
 - There are reports from 004 and 022 that a bus not affiliated with the New Arrivals Mission is attempting to drop off people at these police districts.
 - 008 District: 04 OCT 2023, Disturbance
 - A migrant was caught smoking cigarettes in the 008th District Lobby bathroom around 0130hrs on 04OCT23. He was informed that he is no longer allowed to be in the 008th district lobby unless an emergency and is to use provided facilities outside of location due to failure to follow rules.
 - 008 District: 01 OCT 2023, Disturbance

- Two victims filed a report under [REDACTED] in the 003rd District however, the incident occurred in the 008 District at 7819 S. Trumbull. They returned to 003 and informed the desk they could physically identify (no offender name) which tent the offender was living in outside the 003 District and wished to sign complaints. DSS came into roll call to assign a vehicle to relocate with her outside to investigate further and upon her return to the desk the victims had left without pointing said offender out.

 - At 0205 hours, an intoxicated person started kicking a couple of the migrants outside the lobby area. A couple seconds later, 20 plus migrants were fighting the offender, which caused him to flee on foot northbound on State.
