Border News:

- For the week ending October 07, 2023, according to the weekly DHS report, 2,822 noncitizens provided an intended destination of Chicagoland, down from 3,245 last week.
- After a weeks-long closure due to a migrant surge in Eagle Pass, Texas, U.S. Customs and Border Protection officials said they plan to reopen Bridge 1 to vehicular traffic on Monday. CBP officials late Sunday announced that officers would "resume vehicle processing operations at Bridge 1 in Eagle Pass, Texas," a CBP official said.

Situational Awareness:

• Chicago:

o The Amundsen Park Fieldhouse is slated to eventually take in incoming migrants, but residents protested, and they have filed a temporary restraining order to stop Amundsen from become a shelter. It will go before a Cook County judge for a hearing on Tuesday at 9:30 a.m.

• New York:

o New York is now going to be instituting a 60-day limit for families at shelters and 30-day limit for singles. Those who are not able to secure housing outside the shelter system after the time limit elapses must go to the migrant intake center at the Roosevelt Hotel in Midtown Manhattan to apply for a new shelter bed.

• Boston:

Mass. expects to reach its emergency shelter capacity of 7,500 families by the end of October, Democratic Gov. Maura Healey said Monday. The state is already housing nearly 7,000 families — 23,000 people in 90 communities — about half of whom are migrant families, Healey said. While Healey insists the state won't stop enforcing its right-to-shelter law, the space limitations could force families onto the street until they get off a waitlist.

mentioned vehicle flee Westbound on 63rd St. The victim had a swollen upper lip and multiple swollen markings on his back from the impact of the paintballs. The victim did not want to make a report but was transported to University of Chicago Hospital where he would be treated and released. 001
