Border News:

• For the week ending **October 13, 2023**, according to the weekly DHS report, **2,822** noncitizens provided an intended destination of Chicagoland, down from **3,245** last week.

• According to the El Paso migrant awareness dashboard, a primary shelter had 160 migrants on Sunday, 15 OCT. This is compared to the Saturday prior when 310 were housed there.

• The federal government would be barred from immigration policies that separate parents from children for eight years under a proposed court settlement announced Monday that also provides families that were split under the Trump administration with temporary legal status and short-term housing aid. <u>https://apnews.com/article/separated-children-trump-biden-border-immigration-f9a73685d0ddbcda86e5b69997f5f7dd</u>

• Border Patrol agents have apprehended 19 Iranians and 17 Syrians since Monday. The apprehensions come amid concerns of security and the potential of terrorism after Hamas-led terrorists invaded Israel on Oct. 7, killing 1,300 Israelis and wounding thousands more. The Department of Homeland Security's threat assessment, published last month, noted that agents have encountered a growing number on the watch list and warned that "terrorists and criminal actors may exploit the elevated flow and increasingly complex security environment to enter the United States."

Situational Awareness:

Chicago:

• At the hearing today regarding the TRO to stop migrants from being housed at Amundsen, the Judge denied there was a need for emergency action because it has not been decided by the city if it will be used as a shelter. If the park does become a shelter, the judge said they could refile an emergency hearing to try to stop it.

• New York: (Current census: 61,400 / Total reported: 126,000)

• City Hall said it would begin distributing notices to families with children telling them they had to leave and reapply for shelter after 60 days, while families with children entering the system would be sent to a tent shelter at Floyd Bennett Field in Brooklyn when it opens in the coming weeks. Until now, migrant families with children have been placed in individual hotel rooms spread out across the city. An employee from the Chicago Department of Revenue was at the 008 District station today to repair the self-service machine in the lobby. He told me that he has been out several times to several different stations to make the same repairs, and it is because the migrants are unplugging the machine in order to use the outlet to charge their cell phones. He said it has been an ongoing issue and asked that it be documented on our end, and he documented the same to his department.

024 District: 16 OCT 23, Aggravated Battery

There was a report of a group of 10 to 15 migrants fighting near 7250-7300 N. Western. Shortly afterward a call was received from the shelter manager of the YMCA located at 2424 W. Touhy that a victim and resident of the shelter had walked in with stab wounds. Victim, a refugee,

suffered a laceration to the back of the head and puncture wound to the back and will be treated at St. Francis hospital in stable condition. Victim is not being cooperative. This incident is reported under RD#

022 District: 15 OCT 23, Arrest

Arrest of migrant for the battery of another migrant. Nose was broken and he needs eventual surgery. Offender is still staying in the 022nd District in one of the tents. No conflicts so far. Victim went to court for an order of protection and the sheriff misdirected him believing the only court for an order of protection was 555 W. Harrison. Probably going to return to 727 E. 111th Street tomorrow for the order of protection.

022 District: Ongoing, Mail Issue

Issue regarding district reciving asylum seeker related mail after they have been transferred.

001 District: 16 OCT 23, Arrests

5 migrants were arrested, 3 for criminal trespass to CTA and 2 for retail theft.

003 District: 15 OCT 2023, Auto Accident

CPD observed a motor vehicle accident involving a Chevrolet Impala and a motorized scooter at 6401 S. University. While the injuries were limited to none; EMS was on scene and medical services were declined. This incident involved individuals who are suspected as being migrants and he was issued citations for no driver's license and uninsured motor vehicle.

003 District: 15 OCT 2023, Graffiti

East Side wall of the building was tagged with letters "CES" in black spray paint.

001 District: Ongoing, SR Issue

A volunteer came into 001 to speak with CPD. She advised that now migrants are refusing to get SR Numbers. The volunteer advised that they are doing this so they can go to work and have family and friends watch their children and not having to worry about being moved to another location.

A female migrant was involved in a stabbing incident at a laundromat near 014. The patient was transported to a local hospital and more information will follow as to the extent of the incident.
