Situational Awareness:

- New York:
 - o A new judge has been assigned to rule on Mayor Eric Adams' request to suspend the city's "right to shelter" requirement as migrants fill facilities for the homeless. Acting Manhattan Supreme Court Justice Gerald Lebovits, assigned Friday to the case known as Callahan v. After she took photos and videos of an off-duty state trooper that lives behind the station as he was talking to an on-duty CPD Officer, she approached him and made some comments to him relating to her dislike of him and the police. The gentleman went into his residence, at which time the female advocate called 911 and said that a male Hispanic in his 50's wearing a blue sweatshirt was threatening to shoot the migrants. This description matched the trooper. The advocate made a false report to 911 to target the trooper. The incident was recorded under
- An Officer from an outside unit came into station and approached desk and told me that the migrants lit a giant bonfire on the side of the station on Homan. The Officer said he instructed the migrants to put the fire out, and waited on scene until it was done. They used the bottled water that was donated to extinguish the fire.
- o 017 District: 9 OCT 2023, Battery
 - There was an incident outside the 017th District between 2 migrants. which escalated into a physical altercation.
- o 003 District: 7 OCT 2023, Aggravated Battery
 - 2 migrants were shot in front of the 003 District.
- o 001 District: 8 OCT 2023, Safety hazard
 - Migrants put charcoal in front of district, put a shopping cart over it, and lit it on fire for cooking and warmth. CPD put out fire as it's a safety hazard.
- o 017 District: 9 OCT 2023, Constuction
 - Constriction work in front of 017th District. It appears that the city is going to be ripping up the curbs in front of the station and putting in new curbs and light poles. They came out today and cut some cement and marked up the curbs and sidewalk and left. They said they are beginning Monday, and it is expected to last 3 months This is going to cause issues with our overcrowding of migrants in front of the station.
