- For the week ending **September 30, 2023**, according to the weekly DHS report, **3.245** noncitizens provided an intended destination of Chicagoland, up from **2,753** last week.

• According to a press release from Governor Abbott's Office on 6 October, Texas has bused:

- Over 12,500 migrants to Washington, D.C. since April 2022
- Over 18,500 migrants to New York City since August 2022
- Over 13,500 migrants to Chicago since August 2022
- Over 3,200 migrants to Philadelphia since November 2022
- Over 3,200 migrants to Denver since May 18
- Over 940 migrants to Los Angeles since June 14

Situational Awareness:

• New York:

• The Salvation Army has been facilitating the rampant migration of asylum seekers into New York City, funding their efforts using FEMA emergency cash, and adding to the Big Apple's crisis. Reports emerged this week the charity has been helping migrants fly into New York City despite the asylum seekers already being inside the United States.

• Boston:

• A team from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is coming to Massachusetts to assess the migrant situation and see what needs to be done. In a statement, a White House spokesperson said, in part, "In continued support of the City of Boston and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, a DHS team will be deployed to assess the current migrant situation and identify ways to improve efficiencies and maximize our support for communities that are addressing the needs of migrants

• Denver:

• Denver's has asked officials at border towns to distribute fliers telling asylum seekers to stay away from the Colorado capital, after 21,000 new migrants arrived this year. The city currently has about 2,510 migrants staying in temporary shelters and has spent about \$26 million on the crisis. Matthew Mueller, the executive director for the Office of Emergency Management, has asked officials in Brownsville, El Paso, Houston, and Dallas to let migrants know Denver 'can no longer provide the same level of sheltering resources to newly arriving persons.'
