Today: A 30% chance of rain, mainly after 1600. Increasing clouds, with a high near 62. Light and variable wind becoming east southeast 5 to 10 mph in the morning.

Tonight: Rain and possibly a thunderstorm. Some of the storms could produce small hail and heavy rain. Steady temperature around 56. East wind 5 to 10 mph. Chance of precipitation is 100%. New rainfall amounts between three quarters and one inch possible.

Thursday: Rain and possibly a thunderstorm. High near 59. East wind 10 to 15 mph, with gusts as high as 20 mph. Chance of precipitation is 100%. New precipitation amounts between a quarter and half of an inch possible.

Border News:

• For the week ending **September 30, 2023**, according to the weekly DHS report, **3.245** noncitizens provided an intended destination of Chicagoland, up from **2,753** last week.

• The El Paso City Council on Tuesday renewed a pair of emergency ordinances so that municipal employees can deploy to nonprofits and the city is free to provide migrants shelter as needed. The 7-0 vote with the consent of Mayor Oscar Leeser keeps the ordinances in place for another 30 days. The council originally approved them on May 8, 2023. "In the last three to four days the numbers dropped down 1,000 people per day. So, we've gone from 1,700 (daily migrant encounters) to 600. CBP released a big chunk of those migrants on parole or with notices to appear in federal immigration court at a later date.

• Mexico's president rejected a U.S. request to set up migrant transit centers in Mexico. Neighboring Guatemala has set up one such center, where migrants can apply for U.S. work and refugee visas. But President Andrés Manuel López Obrador has so far rejected a U.S. request to set up sites in Mexico, noting he would prefer to have such centers in countries that are the sources of migration.

• Incident today involving one of the civilian advocates that comes to the station for the migrants. After she took photos and videos of an off-duty state trooper that lives behind the station as he was talking to an on-duty CPD Officer, she approached him and made some comments to him relating to her dislike of him and the police. The gentleman went into his residence, at which time the female advocate called 911 and said that a male Hispanic in his 50's wearing a blue sweatshirt was threatening to shoot the migrants. This description matched the trooper. The advocate made a false report to 911 to target the trooper. The incident was recorded under JG-457245.

• An Officer from an outside unit came into station and approached desk and told me that the migrants lit a giant bonfire on the side of the station on Homan. The Officer said he instructed the migrants to put the fire out, and waited on scene until it was done. They used the bottled water that was donated to extinguish the fire.

 - There was an incident outside the 017th District between 2 migrants. which escalated into a physical altercation.
