





INVESTIGATION

Following assignment to this complaint on 23 January 2006, the Initiation Report written by Sergeant Thomas DONEGAN, #1764, Unit 002, was reviewed. Sergeant DONEGAN reported that alleged that while driving her vehicle with a male passenger named on 19 January 2006, at approximately 2220 hours, at three male white, plainclothes police officers in an unmarked vehicle bearing Illinois plate M152709, stopped and searched her vehicle without justification, as well as herself, her purse, and her passenger. DONEGAN's report further reflected that alleged one of the officers was verbally abusive towards her and told her to take off her shirt, while the other two officers opened "pants and were verbally abusive towards him."

Motor Maintenance Division records revealed that license plate M152709 was assigned to vehicle #3840, a 2005 Chevrolet Impala, of the 9th District. Consequently, 9th District Attendance and Assignment Records for 19 January 2006, reflected that Tactical Police Officers Timothy HAYES, #7308, John DOWLING, #19486, and Douglas HARTZ, #11757, used vehicle #3840 as Beat 962E from 1700 to 0130 hours.







Regarding the allegation that they failed to generate a contact information card, the officers created a documentation of the traffic stop when they ran the plate through LEADS. All three officers stated that a contact card was filled out and turned into the 9th District. Although there is no record of the contact card being submitted, it is possible that the contact information card was misplaced and not processed by other Department personnel. As such the allegation is not sustained.



The white male told me to stand behind my vehicle and put both of my hands on top of the back of the car. I asked him repeatedly why I was pulled over and he did not tell me. Then the white male approached my passenger and grabbed his belt buckle, unbuckled his belt and started searching down his pants. They did not explain what they were looking for. began to search my vehicle, my trash, glove box, purse, and the passenger's bag.

We just got off the expressway at 47th Street, there's a bridge there where I saw the police car. I saw the cruiser, the 3 guys were in. I thought the driver gave me an unusual look. Immediately pulled over and all 3 rushed to the doors. The officer I identified pulled me out really forcefully, hitting me with his forearm and yelled "When you see a police car you should stop right away". The one I identified ordered me to empty my pockets in my jacket and pants. He patted me on the outside thoroughly then pulled me up to the sidewalk made me unzip my pants and belt and started feeling around my groin area. I was wandering what he was looking for and it made me very nervous. While this was going on they yelled at made her get out of the car and I heard one of them call her the "C" word. She had her hands on the truck of the car standing there with her jacket off. The other two were looking through the car and one was on his radio trying to run the car through the police systems. He looked at my license, but I don't know if he called it in. I'm pretty sure that all 3 of them looked through the purse, my bag. They offered no explanation for stopping us. I think this took about ten minutes.

When they got back theat the car was clean, they immediately bolted back to their car and left us amazingly fast. I asked the one driving for some identification and he said meet him at 51st Street at Wentworth.


C.R. # 310739 ATTACHMENT # 8 14 It is with great regret that I am forced to write this letter. As a Chicagoan I have spent more time defending the CPD than I would guess just about anyone. I believe that they do a terrific job keeping me, my family, and by and large the city of Chicago safe. However, the incident occurring on the night of January 19 is one that is so egregious and abusive that I can not sit still without reporting it in detail.

On the said night I was traveling, as a passenger in the car of my (who has already provided her own statement and complaint) on 47th Street just passed the Dan Ryan Expressway when I noticed a sedan, license plate number M152709, being driven by a middle aged gentleman with some other people in the car, who I mistakenly thought were his family. I thought that the drive gave me a strange look but thought nothing of it until about a block later when we saw the lights of their cruiser flash. We immediately pulled over and three middle aged men, jumped out of their car and ran up to both mine and the driver's door.

I was pulled from the car and immediately started getting physically abused (at least to or three forearm jabs to the face) by one of the men who, while yelling at me and using profanity, never offered any explanation for stopping us or even identified himself as a police officer. I was continually berated and told to empty all of the pockets of my pants and jacket, which I promptly did.

The officer then took my ID and I was then fully patted down, all the way to my socks before being shoved on the sidewalk, where the officer took off my belt, unzipped and opened my pants and started feeling around my groin. I can attest to you that this was the most humiliating experience of my life. Again I can not stress enough times that I was never informed of any reason for either the stop or the searches.

As all this was going on was also forced from the car, told to remover her jacket, and, forced to stand in the back of the car with her hands on the trunk. As I was pulled from the vehicle I heard one of the men call her a cunt among other verbal abuses. We also were forced to watch as they searched car and purse repeatedly. As I was never worried that they would find anything I became more and more furious while at the same time worrying greatly about the safety of and myself, however I can tell you that I was very worried not only about our safety but our very lives.



When the officers, again having never identified themselves, realized that both of us had nothing in our past that would suggest anything criminal, and that there was nothing suggesting illegal activity on our person or in the vehicle, they immediately bolted toward their car again offering absolutely no explanation let alone an apology. I immediately asked for each of their ID numbers and the name of their superior officer at which time I was told to come to an address on 51st ST and the men then sped off as quickly as they had arrived. I can only describe these men as three white, dark haired men in their late thirty's or early forty's. They were each wearing jeans and dark jackets, armed with pistols and carrying police radios.



- You have no right to remain silent. You have an obligation to truthfully answer questions put to you. You are advised that your statements or responses constitute an official police report.
- 5. If you refuse to answer questions put to you, you will be ordered by a superior officer to answer the questions.
- 6. If you persist in your refusal after the order has been given to you, you are advised that such refusal constitutes a violation of the Rules and Regulations of the Chicago Police Department and will serve as a basis for which your discharge will be sought.
- 7. You are further advised that by law any admission or statement made by you during the course of this hearing, interrogation or examination and the fruits hereof cannot be used against you in a subsequent criminal proceeding.

CHARGES/ALLEGATIONS

The law provides that if you are to be charged with a criminal offense or if your separation from the Department will be sought, you are to be advised in writing of the specific illegal or improper acts alleged against or attributed to you.

Furthermore, Department policy provides that you have a right to be advised in writing of the names of complainants and allegations against you prior to any questioning of you concerning the allegation regardless of the nature of the allegation and even if the allegation is such that it will not result in the filing of criminal charges or the filing of separation charges.

Accordingly, you are hereby advised that the following allegations have been attributed to you:
