Dear Mr. Glynn:

The Chicago Police Department (CPD) is in receipt of your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 ILCS 140/1, et seq., request for the following:

"Records sufficient to show all "investigative alerts" entered and approved into CHRIS (per Special Order S04-16 Section III) from Jan 1, 2018 to the date CPD conducts this search. I am seeking records sufficient to show both types of investigative alerts as specified in Special Order S04-16 Section II.A. Please include all data listed in Special order S04-16 Section III.F."

As permitted by 5 ILCS 140/3(e), the time was extended in order to conduct a thorough search for these records. Your request was reviewed by the undersigned. A search was conducted based on the parameters provided. The Bureau of Technical Services – Data Fulfillment and Analysis Section of the Strategic Data Analytics Division has provided the responsive records to your request. However, please be aware that certain information has been redacted pursuant to 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(a).

Please be advised that records are redacted pursuant to the Juvenile Court Act of 1987, 705 ILCS 405/1 et seq. ("JCA"). 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(a) of the FOIA statute exempts from disclosure, "[i]nformation specifically prohibited from disclosure by federal or State law or rules and regulations implementing federal or State law." The Illinois Juvenile Court Act of 1987 strictly restricts the disclosure of law enforcement records that pertain to a juvenile's arrest, charge, or investigation. Such information must be withheld in full pursuant to 705 ILCS 405/5-905(5); 705 ILCS 405/1-7(c). Specifically, pursuant to Sec. 1-7(c): "[t]he records of law enforcement officers, or of an independent agency created by ordinance and charged by a unit of local government with the duty of investigating the conduct of law enforcement officers, concerning all minors under 18 years of age must be maintained separate from the records of arrests and may not be open to public inspection or their contents disclosed to the public." 705 ILCS 405/1-7(C). Therefore, because there are records pertaining to a juvenile, this information is redacted under 5 ILCS 140/7 (1)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act, which exempts from production "information specifically prohibited from disclosure by a federal or State law or rules and regulation adopted under federal or state law."
