RE: New York State Commission of Corrections Complaint [REDACTED]

On January 5th, 2022 I was instructed to conduct an investigation into New York State Commission of Corrections Complaint [REDACTED]. The complaint was authored by Inmate [REDACTED]. Upon receipt of the complaint, Inmate [REDACTED] was no longer in the custody of the Orange County Sheriff. Inmate [REDACTED] was turned over to the New York State Department of Corrections December 31st 2021. In his complaint, Inmate [REDACTED] makes several vague allegations towards staff. The validity of some of these complaints cannot be verified or properly investigated as Inmate [REDACTED] did not provide specific incidents, dates, times or in some cases names of staff which he references in his complaint. Additionally, the basis of his complaint is in reference to Grievance [REDACTED]. The complaints were investigated by the Facility Grievance Coordinator, denied on merits, and forwarded to the Citizens Policy and Complaint Review Council on December 21st 2021. I will address each complaint in the order listed by Inmate Youngs.

Inmate [REDACTED] claims that the facility is "constantly" out of clothing items and games:

The facility keeps an adequate supply of games and clothing which are stored in the main warehouse. These supplies are replenished as needed. The facility does not replace games and other items solely based on a request from the inmate population. These items are replaced as needed based on normal wear and tear and damage. Clothing items are stored in the main warehouse and property room. These items are laundered and recirculated for use. As answered in grievance [REDACTED] a 3xl jumpsuit was not immediately available upon his request 12/2/21. Inmate [REDACTED] was issued a larger jumpsuit size until 12/6/21. At no time was Inmate [REDACTED] deprived of facility issued clothing.

Inmate [REDACTED] claims that the coffee supplied to the inmate population is cold and meals are lukewarm:

Coffee is served daily for the breakfast meal. The Coffee and Morning Meal are served at 0600 hours. The coffee is served in an insulated container which maintains heat for several hours. The lukewarm meal referenced by Inmate [REDACTED] is in fact not served as a hot meal. The French toast bake which he references is a meant to be served and consumed at room temperature. This is not a "hot meal". This complaint was also answered by the Facility Food Services Director in written format. Inmate [REDACTED] also references a complaint

to Sergeant Kyle Mann on November 6th 2020 in regarding meal service several days prior, November 2nd 2020. Inmate [REDACTED] complained that there were rocks in his beans. It was established that the hard item he complained of was an uncooked bean. The Facility Food Director agreed that the Kitchen staff would continue to make every effort to remove these items prior to meal service. As per his written memorandum, Sergeant Mann explained this to Inmate [REDACTED] and other inmates who had complained of the issue. No inmate requested a grievance regarding the matter and accepted that the Kitchen would make every effort to correct the issue.

Inmate [REDACTED] claims that between 1230 and 1300 hours, no inmate is permitted to recreate, and that cell confined inmates were permitted more recreation time then allowable:

Inmate [REDACTED] is currently housed in the facility protective custody unit per his own request. During his current incarceration inmate [REDACTED] was the subject of 11 keep separates. Keep separates which were initiated as a result of requests from himself or other inmates or as a result of physical altercations. These keep separates necessitated the implementation of a staggered recreation scheduled which allows all inmates the required minimum requirements for recreation purposes. No inmate is deprived of the appropriate amount of out of cell activity. The scheduled was created on a rotating basis as to allow each group out of cell activity time at daily alternating times.

Inmate [REDACTED] claims that the "internal reporting" procedure for issues related to tablet software to the "facility liaison" are avoided:

The facility does not have a "liaison" for issues related to tablet software. The tablets are outfitted with a customer service number. All staff are trained with the basic knowledge of tablet functions. Supervisory Staff are tasked with attempting to resolve any issues within the scope of their training. Any issues that are not resolvable are brought to the attention of the Shift Commander for further action.

Inmate [REDACTED] claims that Sergeant William Proscia denied him a grievance:

Sergeant William Proscia has authored a memorandum explaining the facts and circumstances regarding the allegation. Sergeant Proscia explains that while conducting a supervisory round, Inmate [REDACTED] began to yell and demand a grievance regarding the recreation schedule. Sergeant Proscia attempted to calm Inmate [REDACTED] to have him explain what the issue was to try and resolve the issue. Inmate [REDACTED] became disrespectful towards Sergeant Proscia and was reminded that he had previously grieved the recreation schedule. Because of Inmate [REDACTED] disruptive conduct Sergeant Proscia exited the unit to allow time for Inmate [REDACTED] to calm down and follow up on his complaint. On a follow up supervisory rounds Inmate [REDACTED] walked away from Sergeant Proscia and did not speak to him regarding the matter.

Inmate [REDACTED] claims that Sergeant James Miller denied him a grievance:

Sergeant James Miller has authored a memorandum in which he states that at no time did Inmate [REDACTED] ask for a grievance. Inmate [REDACTED] made this claim after being issued an Inmate misbehavior Report for using the unit microwave during a time frame in which its use is not permitted. Inmate [REDACTED] was to be issued an informal disciplinary sanction and refused. This led to a formal Inmate Misbehavior Report being issued to allow for due process. Inmate [REDACTED] claims that he spoke to an officer regarding refusing he informal discipline. He does not name the Officer. I am unable to determine who Inmate [REDACTED] is referring to as he does not specify.

Inmate [REDACTED] claims that Sergeant Nicholas Gessner did not allow for witnesses during a disciplinary hearing and that Officer Ricardo Laudato falsified the Inmate Misbehavior report :

Inmate [REDACTED] appealed the decision made during disciplinary hearing [REDACTED] to the Chief Administrative Officer or Designee. In accordance with Section 7006.10 of the New York State Minimum standards all disciplinary testimony was reviewed. It was found that the disciplinary process was conducted fairly and in accordance with departmental policy and procedure. There is no evidence to support Inmate Youngs claim that staff falsified the Inmate Misbehavior Report.

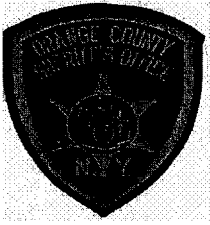
Inmate [REDACTED] claims that the facility is violating New York State law in regard to COVID 19 restrictions and that cleanliness a sanitation issues exist:

The facility has gone to great lengths to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all Inmates, Corrections Staff and Civilian Staff which work within the facility in regard to the COVID-19 virus. This includes sanitizing units at minimum three times daily, the use of ionizers throughout the facility daily. Details which include the cleaning of all facility door handles and commonly touches items three times per shift. And although unfortunate to the inmate population, the restriction of contact visiting. This restriction was necessary to prevent the spread of the virus within the facility and to protect the health and well being of all persons. These restrictions were put in place in accordance with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as well as the New York State Department of Health. The restrictions are not solely in the County of Orange but have been implemented and imposed by the New York State Department of Corrections and several Counties within the State of New York. The restrictions are evaluated periodically and revised based on spikes/drops of COVID-19 cases within the county.

Inmate [REDACTED] concludes with several non specific complaints regarding inadequate supplies, forms, cold housing units, unfulfilled law library and property requests, retaliation from staff, denied grievances by various sergeants, an allegation of staff spitting at him, and an alleged "cover up" in regard to Officer Laudato falsifying a report. The facility maintains an adequate supply of all forms which are available to the inmate population. Inmate [REDACTED] provides no supporting documentation or details regarding an alleged claim that he was spit on by staff. Inmate [REDACTED] requests video footage be reviewed to confirm if he made any comments towards Officer Laudato. This is a moot request as the facility video footage does not record audio. Inmate [REDACTED] claims that the facility cleaning records are falsified. This allegation is blatantly false. The law library is open for inmate use 5 days per week. Legal services are also available on the inmate tablet software through the lexis nexus program, which is accessible from 0830 to 2230 hours seven days per week. The temperature in all areas of the facility is set at 70 degrees. In conclusion I find that Inmate [REDACTED] complaints are either unfounded or unsubstantiated due to lack of supporting information on his behalf. The original complaints were all investigated and answered by the Facility Grievance Coordinator. Inmate [REDACTED] appealed this decision, as well as the decision of the Chief Administrative Officer. The appeal was forwarded to the Citizens Policy and Complaint Review Council. All supporting memorandums and documentation are attached.

I am authoring this memorandum at the direction of Lt. Moreno, L. regarding a complaint filed by former Inmate [REDACTED] On December 1, 2021 at 0907hrs. while working as the Bravo Wing Sergeant the following occurred. While conducting supervisory rounds with Lt. Moreno in [REDACTED] [REDACTED] immediately approached me upon entering the unit and began yelling in a loud voice "I want a grievance, this rec. schedule is bullshit." I responded by saying "Good morning sir" and asking him what the problem was. Inmate [REDACTED] responded stating "Im not saying good morning to you because i don't fucking like you." I calmly explained to Inmate [REDACTED] that I will attempt to address his concern informally in accordance with NYS minimum standards sec 70.32. Inmate [REDACTED] responded by yelling in a agitated tone "Do your fucking job." I advised Inmate [REDACTED] that I will not speak to him if he does not calm down and that i will not stand there and be yelled at. I reminded Inmate [REDACTED] that he has grieved the rec. schedule several times and was denied because the facility is within NYS minimal Standards guidelines regarding recreation for a protective custody housing unit. I then completed my supervisory rounds in [REDACTED] housing unit and exited the unit. Upon completing my third supervisory round in [REDACTED] on the same date, Inmate [REDACTED] did not attempt to speak to me and walked in the other direction when i entered the housing unit. End of memorandum.

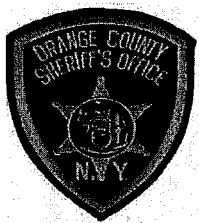
I am authoring this memo at the direction of Luis Moreno 020. Former Inmate [REDACTED] made several complaints to the New York State Commission of Correction. Inmate [REDACTED] claims that I stated to him that taking a shower in a stall that hadn't been cleaned was "not a problem". Inmate [REDACTED] also stated that the [REDACTED] showers as well as the rest of the housing unit hadn't been cleaned from 12-9-21 to 12-19-21. At no time have I ever told any inmate that taking a shower in a dirty stall was not a problem. I advised Inmate [REDACTED] that if he was worried about the cleanliness of the shower he wanted to use, the unit had supplies readily available such as a shower brush and bleach for him to clean the shower. Inmate [REDACTED] refused to clean the shower stating that it was not his job. As for the [REDACTED] unit and showers not being cleaned from 12-9-21 to 12-19-21. All units in the facility are cleaned daily. [REDACTED] had an inmate assigned as the trustee to clean the unit daily. All inmates were advised that due to COVID, they were responsible for cleaning the showers before and after each use. Cleaning supplies were made readily available to anyone who requested them. End of memorandum.

At 0650 hours Officer Laudato notified me that Inmate [REDACTED] had refused to sign the IA. I then went down and spoke with Inmate [REDACTED] and he stated that he did not care that he would be placed in cell confinement. I then left and at 0710 hours I went back to [REDACTED] and had Inmate [REDACTED] sign his statement of confinement. At no time did Inmate [REDACTED] ask me for a grievance. End of report.

RE: Claims regarding denied grievances by former Inmate [REDACTED]

I am authoring this memorandum regarding claims made by former Inmate [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] claims that in the past, I had denied him grievances that he had requested. It is the policy of the Orange County Sheriff's Office that if an inmate requests a grievance, all reasonable attempts to resolve the issue will be made. If an acceptable resolution can not be made, a grievance will be issued to the inmate. This is further guaranteed by New York State Minimum Standard 7032. At no time did Mr. [REDACTED] request a grievance and I denied him access. Mr. [REDACTED] further claims that on 11/6/2020, he brought to my attention an issue with his meal tray from 11/2/2020. I do recall speaking to Mr. [REDACTED] regarding his meal. Mr. [REDACTED] was not the only inmate that had complained about the meal, stating there were "pebbles" in their beans. I did speak to the Trinity staff Justin Iorio, addressing this complaint. I was told by the Trinity staff that the hard bits were uncooked beans and that every attempt was being made to remove these hard, uncooked beans before meals were plated and left the kitchen. This information was relayed to the inmates that had complained about their meal. No inmate, including Mr. [REDACTED] requested a grievance regarding this matter. End of Memorandum.

To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing a response to the decision of the above grievance given to me today by the facility. The facility has made clear that no rebuttal argument may be submitted by me. I will address the items in the original submitted order.

1. 3xl jumpsuits were not available for over a month. I was not given a larger size until after the 12-2-21 incident when I asked CO Dolezal why I hadn't gotten one yet and he said they were out. The facility is constantly out of different clothing and games (I finally bought my own Scrabble Dictionary). Inmates rarely complain via grievance due to the struggle to get one and the retaliation often suffered.

2. I was told the 'coffee' we are given is 'Tea' so that is just confusion, I have no doubt the coffee is hot when it arrives on the unit but when breakfast is served 1-2 hours after it arrives, it's no longer hot. The kitchen is constantly complained about by inmates. We are told to get used to it. Grievances are met with resistance and retaliation and complaints get ignored. This is similar to when Sergeant Mann reported on 11-6-20 that no one else had complained of rocks in the beans when Justin Iorio stated on 11-2-20 that he replaced my tray. Obviously this was not my tray as Sergeant Mann states he didn't replace my food. This raises the question, whose tray did they replace, because obviously that person complained too.

3. From 12:30-1 no inmates were scheduled to be out from either 'Keep-separate' group. This is a violation of NYCRR 7075.4(a) as three inmates were not Keep-locked and therefore not segregated during this 1/2 hour. Additionally, while I cannot, and was not, grieving the two no-contacts getting more than four hours, I was grieving, and can grieve, that I was being treated unfairly because they were getting more rec than policy allowed, which took away

from my rec time. Members of the staff apparently agree with me as the schedule has been improvised daily to adjust for the things I grieved. However, the schedule should have been corrected in its computer-generated form.

4. Obviously tablet software cannot be grieved, which is why I did not grieve that. What I grieved, and has been totally avoided, is that problems are not reported to GTL as the liaison officer is wholly unaware of said problems. This 'Internal Reporting' is grievable and the subject of my grievance.

5. Whether or not Sgt Proscia feels it is disrespectful to state "I need a grievance" without the pleasantries of "Good morning" or "How are you" is irrelevant to the grievance process. His angry reply of "I'm not your bitch" prompted me to reply "I only asked you to do your job" to which he replied it was his job to fix the issue, not hand out grievances. I simply replied, "then fix the schedule." Many sgt's, if asked only to fix the issue, will ignore the problem and only asking for a grievance gives them a 'deadline'. I apologize that I walked away from Sgt Proscia but I was unaware he wanted to talk to me as he never made any apparent sign that he wanted to talk. Sgt Proscia has always been hostile towards me and

I avoided him after our initial exchange so further hostilities would not have room to breed. As CO Andujar informed me that he had not been asked of the issues with the schedule I am curious as to how Sgt Proscia had 'investigated' my complaint.

6. Sergeant Miller has strong reason to claim that I did not ask for a grievance. The officer I spoke to just before I refused the IA is the only one without reason to make false statements yet it seems he was not asked for a report.

7/8. On 12-8-21 I was found guilty by Sergeant Gessner at a hearing. Sgt Gessner refused to call any of my witnesses. Also, as I understand, this was one of his only hearings during his years here. I was given the strong impression that he was chosen to find me guilty regardless of the evidence. The fact that Captain Potter backed his finding without calling any witnesses supports this. Calling witnesses is a right under 7006.8(d). Additionally, Sergeant Gessner confirmed that the camera showed that I did not say anything when CO Laudato stated I said "I'm going to use the microwave." Sgt Gessner informed me this was irrelevant as I was "running my mouth" all the way back to my cell. I can claim I did not insult CO Laudato, but it can not be proven any more than he can prove I did without a lip-reader.


However, since it is obvious, evident, and accepted that I did not say anything when he claimed I said one thing; the veracity of his entire report becomes questionable. Furthermore, I did not, and was not, going to file a grievance about the use of the microwave. However, it is not a written policy and therefore I cannot be charged with using it, and I wasn't.

9. The CDC guidelines do not override the law of New York state. The guidelines are only followed as far as restricting inmates. The guidelines for protecting an inmate's mental health are being wholly ignored.

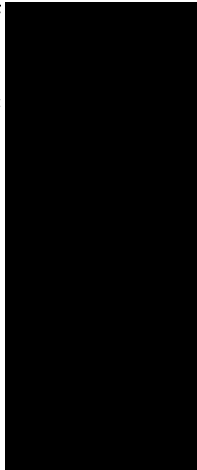
Conclusion: As usual for the OCSO, the investigation for this grievance was incomplete. 7032.3(b-5) is written to prevent retaliation for filing a grievance, but the grievance process, which does not match the grievance policy, allows inmates to be retaliated against just for asking for the form, as was done here. The OCSO has gone to great lengths to cover-up what was done here and to shield CO Laudato for his actions. I respectfully request that the CO that accompanied CO Laudato on count be questioned and the footage of the incident be reviewed to see if I said anything to Laudato before using the microwave, as he claims, and if the count CO did indeed stop and talk

to me, as I claimed. Lastly, I request a on-site review of the facility's grievance process. From 12-9-21 to 12-19-21 our unit [REDACTED] has had the showers cleaned once, and nothing else cleaned at all. Officers falsify the trustee report weekly. Sgt Murphy told me taking a shower in a stall that hasn't been cleaned in a week is not a problem. Sgt Proscia stated he didn't care what happens on the unit. Sgt Cimarelli ignored the written request I sent him. Lt Kiszka feels the problem is beneath him. The facility will not be hug my three-year-old or kiss my fiance because of COVID but jail order [REDACTED] which requires bleaching the unit three times daily, & not even followed once a week. The food is always cold, the unit is always freezing. Property release forms are trashed unless a sergeant fulfills them. Law library requests are left on officer desks and unfulfilled. Inmates that are the loudest and most aggressive are given whatever they want while rule-abiding inmates get ignored. Officers are allowed to retaliate whenever they want and are backed by the command staff. I have been spit on by an officer, lied to, retaliated against, and threatened. Grievances that are actually fought ~~and~~ for and filed are ~~not~~ given irrelevant or negligent responses. The facility claims "no other complaint was made" but the grievance

officer himself stated that if grievance forms were easily accessible then he would receive three-hundred per day. He is correct. Right now sergeants have no motivation for solving a grievance per 7032.3(b-4) as they can decline them, as Sgt Proscia always does, or deny that we requested them, as Sgt Miller did. They rely on the fact that the next sergeant will either solve the problem for them, as Sgt Daniels does, or use some ridiculous excuse to deny it, as Sgt Mann does. When a grievance is finally obtained and filed the issue is distorted, as #4 above, ignored, as #1 & 2 above, or denied. This is creating an atmosphere of helplessness, anger, frustration, and tension. I request a true inquiry by an outside party to determine the extent that the OCSO has gone to in order to subvert inmates. Thank you for your time and consideration.

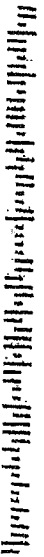
