On January 14, 2020, I tasked Sergeant Jesse Weed to investigate claims made by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] made complaints, in writing to Governor Andrew Cuomo, of health concerns, safety concerns, and diet concerns. The complaints were then forwarded to the New York State Commission of Corrections and assigned Complaint [REDACTED]. The complaints were then forwarded to this facility which currently houses [REDACTED]. Upon completion of Sergeant Weed's investigation, I find [REDACTED] claims to be unfounded pursuant to his housing in our facility. All supporting documentation will accompany this Memorandum. 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MEMORANDUM

On January 14, 2020 I was tasked by Lieutenant Mark Berlinski 017 with interviewing and gathering information pertaining to a letter that was sent to the Office of New York State Governor Andrew Cuomo by ICE Detainee [REDACTED]. The letter was then directed to the New York State Commission of Corrections and assigned complaint #117349. In the letter, Detainee [REDACTED] made complaints of 1) Concerns of his health (seizures and possible depression). 2) Being threatened, bullied and strong armed by gang members of "La Mara Salvatrucha MS-13" and 3) his vegetarian meal. The following are my findings to the complaints made.

Detainee [REDACTED] was transferred from Bergen County Jail into the custody of the Orange County Correctional Facility on 08/28/2019 as a Federal Boarder with Immigration and Customs Enforcement. Upon entry into the facility, Booking staff conducted screening questions in which Detainee [REDACTED] admitted to having a known medical condition (seizure disorder) and denied having any mental health or prior psychological problems. I spoke with Registered Nurse Adrienne Cupertino who advised me that Detainee [REDACTED] entered our facility with transfer paperwork from Bergen County Jail which indicated that he is currently taking medication for seizures. As a result, Detainee [REDACTED] began receiving his medication the evening of 08/28/19. A review of his history since being housed in the Orange County Correctional Facility indicated that Detainee [REDACTED] has been compliant with taking his daily seizure medications. I was further advised that Detainee [REDACTED] has had four (4) seizures while at OCCF and gets his blood drawn regularly to check his [REDACTED] in an attempt to stabilize the seizures. Detainee [REDACTED] last seizure in our custody occurred on 12/06/19. When I asked RN Cupertino if Detainee [REDACTED] was currently taking any mental health medications for depression, she advised me that he is not. I then contacted the mental health department and spoke with his clinician Kathy Barry. Clinician Barry advised me that she conducted a routine mental health appraisal with Detainee [REDACTED] on 10/19/19. At the time she spoke with Detainee [REDACTED] he did not request any services or indicate that he had any past or current mental health issues. On 10/26/19, clinician Barry conducted a follow up visit with Detainee [REDACTED] and he again did not request any services from the

mental health department. Clinician Barry advised me that Detainee [REDACTED] is not prescribed any mental health medications and has no history of mental health treatment.

The complaint of being threatened, bullied and strong armed by gang members of "La Mara Salvatrucha MS-13" was discussed with Detainee [REDACTED] when I conducted his interview. Detainee [REDACTED] advised me that all of the above mentioned issues with the "La Mara Salvatrucha MS-13" gang members happened when he was housed in the Bergen County Jail. Detainee [REDACTED] advised me that at no time while being housed in the [REDACTED] housing unit at OCCF has he been threatened, bullied or strong armed. Detainee [REDACTED] was then asked if there was anyone that he was having issues with in [REDACTED] and he again advised me "no" I keep to myself and stay away from the other people. Detainee [REDACTED] did advise me that since being involved in a physical altercation at the Bergen County Jail, he does not sleep well and fears retaliation of death if he is deported back to Guatemala.

The complaint of his vegetarian diet stated that his food intake is very limited and believes that it contributes to his "low mood" and "increase in seizures". It was documented that Detainee [REDACTED] requested a vegetarian diet and was placed on such starting 09/04/19. I spoke with Trinity Food Service Director Justin Iorio who stated that the vegetarian meal as analyzed by Jennifer L. Sowers (East Region Dietitian for Trinity Services Group) meets or exceeds the recommended nutrient amounts as specified by Recommended Dietary Allowances from the National Academy of Sciences, American Correctional Association, and National Commission on Correctional Health Care.

During the course of the interview with Detainee [REDACTED] he expressed his guilt that he lives with from having an accident in which he stated he caused because of his seizures and killed his wife and child. He further stated the fear of being deported to a country in which he has no family and could possibly be murdered by members of the "La Mara Salvatrucha MS-13" causes him to have a lot of stress, contributing to his seizures. As a result of the information relayed to me, I submitted a mental health referral and contacted his clinician, Kathy Barry to speak with Detainee [REDACTED] about his wellbeing. At 1840 hours, clinician Barry spoke with Detainee [REDACTED] and advised me that he appears fine and that she would conduct a follow up visit.

All the information gathered in regards to complaint [REDACTED] was turned over to Lieutenant Berlinski. End of memorandum.

Honorable governor First, I must congratulate you and the job; you have done as the governor of this beautiful city as it is New York.

My name is [REDACTED] I am 33 years old. A poor immigrant from Guatemala, DHS/ICE had me and holding me in custody at Orange country jail 110 Wells farm Rd. Goshen New York 10924. I am facing removal proceeding.

I dare to you, because I am seeking Asylum in this country. My health condition (seizure spells) has no treatment in Guatemala, and since I had arrived in U.S.A. This life-saving treatment has being available for me. Also, the gang called "LA MARA SALVATRUCHA MS13" had threatened my life and I need protection please.

I spend most of my life in poverty, born and raise is the Seven Day Adventist Church always fallow my religion everywhere is possible.

I had entered U.S.A. At the age of 17 years old and worked and lived in [REDACTED]

I was a construction worker paying my taxes and living expenses.

After my arrival, I started to race a family. Later on I was involved in a car accident were my wife and son lost their lives. I was sentenced of Manslaughter and Reckless driving in the second degree, a "C," nor violent felony. The cause of the accident was my "seizure spells" Health condition. I had those spells since childhood; is incurable and there is no treatment available in Guatemala. The treatment the doctor put me on based daily pills intake [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] My attorney told me already that, this medicine do not have Guatemala.

Shortly after DHS/ICE holds me in custody, they brought me to a holding prison in custody, to 160 South River Street Hackensack, NJ 07601. As soon as I got there, several inmates, I was disliked by particularly group members of "LA MARA SALVATRUCHA MS13" They are all from Guatemala, have families there, and some of them lived in same neighborhood I used to lived.

I have been heard much about your kind you give to people of New York State.

Because of my health condition. I became a target of their bullying and threats.

On August 25th 2019 one of their gang member jumped into my cell, which was at [REDACTED] and the number of my cell [REDACTED] Since that time I have not sleep well at nights because I know when "LA MARA SALVATRUCHA MS13" issues a treat to murder you, they will do it.

They will fulfill their menace easily in Guatemala. They are dead serious, they are not joking; those thugs are bad people, they want to hurt me and I fear for my life.

Moreover, I do not know anything about Guatemala, and my close relates they are in N.Y. United Stated.

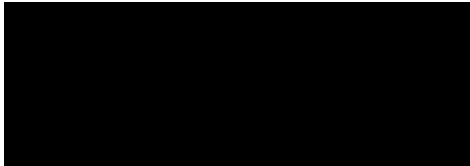
Why am I writhing this latter to you?

For [REDACTED] the best memories of his life have been in the United States. Here, he found the love of his life, who bore him his son. The day he found out he was going to be a father was the best day of his life. He remains forever grateful for having them in his life and has had to live with their deaths everyday of his life. [REDACTED] has suffered so much. With the loss of his partner and son, came the loss of her family. He cannot take away their pain and suffering, but he wants to move forward with his life here in the United States.

[REDACTED] is fearful of returning to Guatemala. His cousin was murdered and believes the same fate will hold true for him. He is also afraid that [REDACTED] family will retaliate against him and that they will kill him. He believes he will not be protected if he is in Guatemala and that they will find him and murder him in response to her death.

Since his meeting with me, [REDACTED] has additional fears of returning to Guatemala based on a fear of retaliation following a recent altercation with a fellow detainee who he believes is a member of the MS-13. Based on my conversation on August 28, 2019 with his attorney, Katherine Buckel, and the review of his declaration on August 25, 2019, [REDACTED] was involved in a physical altercation with [REDACTED] who is allegedly affiliated with MS-13. [REDACTED] reported another detainee, [REDACTED] who is friends with [REDACTED] stated that because of what happened [REDACTED] will get jumped and killed, and that if he sent back to Guatemala he will be killed.

It is our recommendation, that if released back to the community, that [REDACTED] engage in comprehensive medical treatment to help him manage his seizure disorder as well as his depressive symptoms. [REDACTED] has suffered several seizures while being in ICE custody. [REDACTED] has been detained since March 2018. According to Bergen County Jail records [REDACTED] has had five seizures, on May 05, May 06, June 24, July 03 and July 24. Despite [REDACTED] being compliant with the medication, he continues to experience these seizures, and now with more frequency. Furthermore, as he identifies as a vegan, his food intake is very limited. He believes not eating well has contributed to his low mood and also to an increase in seizures.

The trauma of the death of [REDACTED] and his son, as well as the trauma of being incarcerated has weighed heavy on him. According to the report from [REDACTED] meets criteria for Major Depressive Disorder. He has not engaged in any counseling services to help him in managing his emotions and processing all that he has been through. Our office is prepared to assist [REDACTED] in engaging in outpatient mental health treatment to treat his depressive symptoms, as well as assist him referring him to any other services upon his release.

I thank the Court and the Department of Homeland Security for their consideration of the contents of this letter and for the compassion shown toward [REDACTED]
