### **CONCEPT OF OPERATION**

Long Beach Police Department will be redeploying its patrol resources into two geographical divisions encompassing South and West Patrol Divisions in Area A and East and North Patrol Divisions in Area B. These resources will provide situational awareness and mitigate any potential for civil unrest beginning at 18:00 hours on June 2 through 18:00 hours on June 3. The end time and date may be adjusted as necessary.

### MFF Platoon(s)

MFF Platoons will be deployed in mobile field force squads to provide a coordinated rapid response to criminal activity, make arrests, and restore/maintain order. These squads fall under the direction of a MFF Platoon Lieutenant. Squads, or a full platoon, may be deployed for Mutual Aid requests and may be reassigned as departmental needs dictate.

### **Strikeforce**

Strikeforce units are comprised of SWAT officers, K9 officers, and Motor officers. Strikeforce units support MFF Platoons in various roles including: Strikeforce, Counter Assault or any other role requested by the Incident Commander or Watch Commander. They will also provide resources through HNTs and Techs such as Mobile Audio Device (MAD) and Video Surveillance.

### **Field Observers**

Field Observers support MFF Platoons providing real-time intelligence on criminal activity. These units will work in a plainclothes capacity and will direct Task Force/Rapid Response units to help facilitate a coordinated rapid response to unlawful activity and increase effectiveness at making arrests and restoring order. They will also provide situational awareness to the MFF Platoon Lieutenant and the Command Post regarding crowd behavior.

### **Task Force**

Task Force Units primary mission is providing continuous high visibility and situational awareness along major corridors and areas identified as critical infrastructure or potential hot spots for civil unrest. These units will report to a TF Sergeant under the direction of an assigned Lieutenant who may reassign them or re-direct their mission as departmental needs dictate.

### **Force Protection**

Force Protection Units will provide security to Fire Department resources, Booking Van units, and at designated facilities. These units should be especially vigilant for vandalism or trespassing and request appropriate assistance as necessary. They should also be familiar with contingency planning for each location.

# Calls for Service (WC)

CFS Units primary mission is regular calls for service in their respective Patrol Divisions and they will work in their normal chain of command under the direction of the Watch Commander. CFS Units may be re-directed at the discretion of the Watch Commander.

### COMMAND DIRECTION

- All sworn personnel working a field assignment shall be in a Class B uniform and work in two-officer units
- This IAP shall not restrict legal expression of First Amendment rights, but aims to prevent or limit criminal behavior
- Riotous behavior from individuals should be attempted to be stopped in a swift and organized manner before gaining momentum and weighed against officer safety
- Officers should be especially vigilant for random acts of violence against officers or unattended police vehicles
- Engage the law-abiding community in a positive and professional manner

# Watch Commander shall:

- Quickly respond to any reported protest and:
  - Ensure Officers follow attached "Crowd Management Intervention and Control Strategies Guide" for appropriate response to crowd situation
  - Determine appropriate staffing, request additional support, and identify a staging area (if necessary)

### DOC shall:

- Monitor citywide incidents and adjust CFS and TF Units as necessary
- Monitor regional situational awareness
- Maintain up to date departmental staffing in pre-determined squads and forward to Lieutenant Brian McPhail,
   Sergeant Stephanie Hall, and the DOC Manager
- Have a plan for calling in additional department resources, if necessary including:
  - How to call back off duty resources (use Emergency Call Out Rosters, or Communications Center)
  - Where resources should respond and what instructions they will receive
- Provide appropriate updates to:
  - LBPD Command Staff
  - LB Fire Command Staff & BCs
  - Signal Hill Police Chief

### CONTINGENCIES

### Mutual Aid Requests:

- o **Inbound:** All mutual aid requests shall be made through the Incident Commander. The Incident Commander will make mutual aid requests through the DOC. Agencies providing mutual aid will be directed to a Mutual Aid Staging location (consider using the DDR Lot, Vets Stadium, FSD). The Operations Section Chief will designate a Staging Area Manager (STAM) to provide command direction to responding resources.
- Outbound: If requested, the Watch Commander, Incident Commander, and Duty Chief will discuss the status of resources and determine what mutual aid, if any, is available for deployment. If able to be provided, no more than 50% of on duty patrol resources will be directed to stage (tentatively Field Support Division parking lot). The Watch Commander will assign supervision/squads and the group will respond to the incident together. Mutual Aid response equipment and supplies is at Field Support Division in the Mutual Aid Closet (Motor Bay). The key to access the Mutual Aid Closet is in the wall safe outside the Motor Bay (FSD Main Hallway). The wall safe code is 100972#. After accessing the closet, put the key back into the wall safe.

### **CONCEPT OF OPERATION**

Long Beach Police Department will be redeploying its patrol resources into two geographical divisions encompassing South and West Patrol Divisions in Area A and East and North Patrol Divisions in Area B. These resources will provide situational awareness and mitigate any potential for civil unrest beginning at 18:00 hours on June 2 through 18:00 hours on June 3. *The end time and date may be adjusted as necessary.* 

### MFF Platoon(s)

MFF Platoons will be deployed in mobile field force squads to provide a coordinated rapid response to criminal activity, make arrests, and restore/maintain order. These squads fall under the direction of a MFF Platoon Lieutenant. Squads, or a full platoon, may be deployed for Mutual Aid requests and may be reassigned as departmental needs dictate.

### Strikeforce

Strikeforce units are comprised of SWAT officers, K9 officers, and Motor officers. Strikeforce units support MFF Platoons in various roles including: Strikeforce, Counter Assault or any other role requested by the Incident Commander or Watch Commander. They will also provide resources through HNTs and Techs such as Mobile Audio Device (MAD) and Video Surveillance.

### Field Observers

Field Observers support MFF Platoons providing real-time intelligence on criminal activity. These units will work in a plainclothes capacity and will direct Task Force/Rapid Response units to help facilitate a coordinated rapid response to unlawful activity and increase effectiveness at making arrests and restoring order. They will also provide situational awareness to the MFF Platoon Lieutenant and the Command Post regarding crowd behavior.

### **Task Force**

Task Force Units primary mission is providing continuous high visibility and situational awareness along major corridors and areas identified as critical infrastructure or potential hot spots for civil unrest. These units will report to a TF Sergeant under the direction of an assigned Lieutenant who may reassign them or re-direct their mission as departmental needs dictate.

### **Force Protection**

Force Protection Units will provide security to Fire Department resources, Booking Van units, and at designated facilities. These units should be especially vigilant for vandalism or trespassing and request appropriate assistance as necessary. They should also be familiar with contingency planning for each location.

### Calls for Service (WC)

CFS Units primary mission is regular calls for service in their respective Patrol Divisions and they will work in their normal chain of command under the direction of the Watch Commander. CFS Units may be re-directed at the discretion of the Watch Commander.

# **CONTINGENCIES**

### **Mutual Aid Requests:**

- o **Inbound:** All mutual aid requests shall be made through the Incident Commander. The Incident Commander will make mutual aid requests through the DOC. Agencies providing mutual aid will be directed to a Mutual Aid Staging location (consider using the DDR Lot, Vets Stadium, FSD). The Operations Section Chief will designate a Staging Area Manager (STAM) to provide command direction to responding resources.
- Outbound: If requested, the Watch Commander, Incident Commander, and Duty Chief will discuss the status of resources and determine what mutual aid, if any, is available for deployment. If able to be provided, no more than 50% of on duty patrol resources will be directed to stage (tentatively Field Support Division parking lot). The Watch Commander will assign supervision/squads and the group will respond to the incident together. Mutual Aid response equipment and supplies is at Field Support Division in the Mutual Aid Closet (Motor Bay). The key to access the Mutual Aid Closet is in the wall safe outside the Motor Bay (FSD Main Hallway). The wall safe code is 100972#. After accessing the closet, put the key back into the wall safe.

They will also provide resources through HNTs and Techs such as Mobile Audio Device (MAD) and Video Surveillance.

#### Field Observers

Field Observers support MFF Platoons providing real-time intelligence on criminal activity. These units will work in a plainclothes capacity and will direct Task Force/Rapid Response units to help facilitate a coordinated rapid response to unlawful activity and increase effectiveness at making arrests and restoring order. They will also provide situational awareness to the MFF Platoon Lieutenant and the Command Post regarding crowd behavior.

#### **Task Force**

Task Force Units primary mission is providing continuous high visibility and situational awareness along major corridors and areas identified as critical infrastructure or potential hot spots for civil unrest. These units will report to a TF Sergeant under the direction of an assigned Lieutenant who may reassign them or re-direct their mission as departmental needs dictate.

#### **Force Protection**

Force Protection Units will provide security to Fire Department resources, Booking Van units, and at designated facilities. These units should be especially vigilant for vandalism or trespassing and request appropriate assistance as necessary. They should also be familiar with contingency planning for each location.

#### Calls for Service (WC)

CFS Units primary mission is regular calls for service in their respective Patrol Divisions and they will work in their normal chain of command under the direction of the Watch Commander. CFS Units may be re-directed at the discretion of the Watch Commander.

  - How to call back off duty resources (use Emergency Call Out Rosters, or Communications Center)
  - Where resources should respond and what instructions they will receive
- Provide appropriate updates to:
  - LBPD Command Staff
  - LB Fire Command Staff & BCs
  - Signal Hill Police Chief

## **CONTINGENCIES**

#### **Mutual Aid Requests:**

- Inbound: All mutual aid requests shall be made through the Incident Commander. The Incident Commander will make mutual aid requests through the DOC. Agencies providing mutual aid will be directed to a Mutual Aid Staging location (consider using the DDR Lot, Vets Stadium, FSD). The Operations Section Chief will designate a Staging Area Manager (STAM) to provide command direction to responding resources.
- Outbound: If requested, the Watch Commander, Incident Commander, and Duty Chief will discuss the status of resources and determine what mutual aid, if any, is available for deployment. If able to be provided, no more than 50% of on duty patrol resources will be directed to stage (tentatively Field Support Division parking lot). The Watch Commander will assign supervision/squads and the group will respond to the incident together. Mutual Aid response equipment and supplies is at Field Support Division in the Mutual Aid Closet (Motor Bay). The key to access the Mutual Aid Closet is in the wall safe outside the Motor Bay (FSD Main Hallway). The wall safe code is 100972#. After accessing the closet, put the key back into the wall safe.

#### **CONCEPT OF OPERATION**

Long Beach Police Department will be redeploying its patrol resources into two geographical divisions encompassing South and West Patrol Divisions in Area A and East and North Patrol Divisions in Area B. These resources will provide situational awareness and mitigate any potential for civil unrest beginning at 18:00 hours on June 2 through 18:00 hours on June 3. *The end time and date may be adjusted as necessary.* 

#### MFF Platoon(s)

MFF Platoons will be deployed in mobile field force squads to provide a coordinated rapid response to criminal activity, make arrests, and restore/maintain order. These squads fall under the direction of a MFF Platoon Lieutenant. Squads, or a full platoon, may be deployed for Mutual Aid requests and may be reassigned as departmental needs dictate.

#### Strikeforce

Strikeforce units are comprised of SWAT officers, K9 officers, and Motor officers. Strikeforce units support MFF Platoons in various roles including: Strikeforce, Counter Assault or any other role requested by the Incident Commander or Watch Commander. They will also provide resources through HNTs and Techs such as Mobile Audio Device (MAD) and Video Surveillance.

#### Field Observers

Field Observers support MFF Platoons providing real-time intelligence on criminal activity. These units will work in a plainclothes capacity and will direct Task Force/Rapid Response units to help facilitate a coordinated rapid response to unlawful activity and increase effectiveness at making arrests and restoring order. They will also provide situational awareness to the MFF Platoon Lieutenant and the Command Post regarding crowd behavior.

#### **Task Force**

Task Force Units primary mission is providing continuous high visibility and situational awareness along major corridors and areas identified as critical infrastructure or potential hot spots for civil unrest. These units will report to a TF Sergeant under the direction of an assigned Lieutenant who may reassign them or re-direct their mission as departmental needs dictate.

#### **Force Protection**

Force Protection Units will provide security to Fire Department resources, Booking Van units, and at designated facilities. These units should be especially vigilant for vandalism or trespassing and request appropriate assistance as necessary. They should also be familiar with contingency planning for each location.

#### Calls for Service (WC)

CFS Units primary mission is regular calls for service in their respective Patrol Divisions and they will work in their normal chain of command under the direction of the Watch Commander. CFS Units may be re-directed at the discretion of the Watch Commander.

## **CONTINGENCIES**

#### **Mutual Aid Requests:**

- o **Inbound:** All mutual aid requests shall be made through the Incident Commander. The Incident Commander will make mutual aid requests through the DOC. Agencies providing mutual aid will be directed to a Mutual Aid Staging location (consider using the DDR Lot, Vets Stadium, FSD). The Operations Section Chief will designate a Staging Area Manager (STAM) to provide command direction to responding resources.
- Outbound: If requested, the Watch Commander, Incident Commander, and Duty Chief will discuss the status of resources and determine what mutual aid, if any, is available for deployment. If able to be provided, no more than 50% of on duty patrol resources will be directed to stage (tentatively Field Support Division parking lot). The Watch Commander will assign supervision/squads and the group will respond to the incident together. Mutual Aid response equipment and supplies is at Field Support Division in the Mutual Aid Closet (Motor Bay). The key to access the Mutual Aid Closet is in the wall safe outside the Motor Bay (FSD Main Hallway). The wall safe code is 100972#. After accessing the closet, put the key back into the wall safe.

Strikeforce units are comprised of SWAT officers, K9 officers, and Motor officers. Strikeforce units support MFF Platoons in various roles including: Strikeforce, Counter Assault or any other role requested by the Incident Commander or Watch Commander. They will also provide resources through HNTs and Techs such as Mobile Audio Device (MAD) and Video Surveillance.

#### **Field Observers**

Field Observers support MFF Platoons providing real-time intelligence on criminal activity. These units will work in a plainclothes capacity and will direct Task Force/Rapid Response units to help facilitate a coordinated rapid response to unlawful activity and increase effectiveness at making arrests and restoring order. They will also provide situational awareness to the MFF Platoon Lieutenant and the Command Post regarding crowd behavior.

#### **Task Force**

Task Force Units primary mission is providing continuous high visibility and situational awareness along major corridors and areas identified as critical infrastructure or potential hot spots for civil unrest. These units will report to a TF Sergeant under the direction of an assigned Lieutenant who may reassign them or re-direct their mission as departmental needs dictate.

#### **Force Protection**

Force Protection Units will provide security to Fire Department resources, Booking Van units, and at designated facilities. These units should be especially vigilant for vandalism or trespassing and request appropriate assistance as necessary. They should also be familiar with contingency planning for each location.

#### Calls for Service (WC)

CFS Units primary mission is regular calls for service in their respective Patrol Divisions and they will work in their normal chain of command under the direction of the Watch Commander. CFS Units may be re-directed at the discretion of the Watch Commander.

#### **Mutual Aid Requests:**

- o **Inbound:** All mutual aid requests shall be made through the Incident Commander. The Incident Commander will make mutual aid requests through the DOC. Agencies providing mutual aid will be directed to a Mutual Aid Staging location (consider using the DDR Lot, Vets Stadium, FSD). The Operations Section Chief will designate a Staging Area Manager (STAM) to provide command direction to responding resources.
- Outbound: If requested, the Watch Commander, Incident Commander, and Duty Chief will discuss the status of resources and determine what mutual aid, if any, is available for deployment. If able to be provided, no more than 50% of on duty patrol resources will be directed to stage (tentatively Field Support Division parking lot). The Watch Commander will assign supervision/squads and the group will respond to the incident together. The key to access the Mutual Aid Closet is in the wall safe outside the Motor Bay (FSD Main Hallway). The wall safe code is 100972#. After accessing the closet, put the key back into the wall safe.

#### **CONCEPT OF OPERATION**

Long Beach Police Department will be redeploying its patrol resources into two geographical divisions encompassing South and West Patrol Divisions in Area A and East and North Patrol Divisions in Area B. These resources will provide situational awareness and mitigate any potential for civil unrest beginning at 18:00 hours on June 2 through 18:00 hours on June 3. The end time and date may be adjusted as necessary.

#### MFF Platoon(s)

MFF Platoons will be deployed in mobile field force squads to provide a coordinated rapid response to criminal activity, make arrests, and restore/maintain order. These squads fall under the direction of a MFF Platoon Lieutenant. Squads, or a full platoon, may be deployed for Mutual Aid requests and may be reassigned as departmental needs dictate.

#### Strikeforce

Strikeforce units are comprised of SWAT officers, K9 officers, and Motor officers. Strikeforce units support MFF Platoons in various roles including: Strikeforce, Counter Assault or any other role requested by the Incident Commander or Watch Commander. They will also provide resources through HNTs and Techs such as Mobile Audio Device (MAD) and Video Surveillance.

#### Field Observers

Field Observers support MFF Platoons providing real-time intelligence on criminal activity. These units will work in a plainclothes capacity and will direct Task Force/Rapid Response units to help facilitate a coordinated rapid response to unlawful activity and increase effectiveness at making arrests and restoring order. They will also provide situational awareness to the MFF Platoon Lieutenant and the Command Post regarding crowd behavior.

#### **Task Force**

Task Force Units primary mission is providing continuous high visibility and situational awareness along major corridors and areas identified as critical infrastructure or potential hot spots for civil unrest. These units will report to a TF Sergeant under the direction of an assigned Lieutenant who may reassign them or re-direct their mission as departmental needs dictate.

#### **Force Protection**

Force Protection Units will provide security to Fire Department resources, Booking Van units, and at designated facilities. These units should be especially vigilant for vandalism or trespassing and request appropriate assistance as necessary. They should also be familiar with contingency planning for each location.

#### Calls for Service (WC)

CFS Units primary mission is regular calls for service in their respective Patrol Divisions and they will work in their normal chain of command under the direction of the Watch Commander. CFS Units may be re-directed at the discretion of the Watch Commander.

Agencies providing mutual aid will be directed to a Mutual Aid Staging location (consider using the DDR Lot, Vets Stadium, FSD). The Operations Section Chief will designate a Staging Area Manager (STAM) to provide command direction to responding resources.
- Outbound: If requested, the Watch Commander, Incident Commander, and Duty Chief will discuss the status of resources and determine what mutual aid, if any, is available for deployment. If able to be provided, no more than 50% of on duty patrol resources will be directed to stage (tentatively Field Support Division parking lot). The Watch Commander will assign supervision/squads and the group will respond to the incident together. Mutual Aid response equipment and supplies is at Field Support Division in the Mutual Aid Closet (Motor Bay). The key to access the Mutual Aid Closet is in the wall safe outside the Motor Bay (FSD Main Hallway). The wall safe code is 100972#. After accessing the closet, put the key back into the wall safe.

# **Unlawful Assembly Dispersal Order**

- "I am (Peace Officer's name and rank), a peace officer for the City of Long Beach
- I hereby declare this to be an unlawful assembly, and in the name of the People of the State of California, command all those assembled at (specific location) to immediately disperse, which means to break up this assembly
- If you do not disperse, you may be arrested or subject to other police action. Other police action may involve the use of force
- Force used during police action could include the use of batons, electronic control devices, chemical agents, and less lethal munitions
- These types of force may inflict significant pain or discomfort, or result in serious injury
- Penal Code section 409 prohibits remaining present at an unlawful assembly. If you remain in the area of (specific location), regardless of your purpose, you will be in violation of Penal Code section 409.
- The following routes of dispersal are available (state routes)
- You have (reasonable amount of time) minutes to leave the area
