On September 20th, 2011, I was working as the detective sergeant assigned to the Bremerton Police Department's Special Operations Group (SOG). Also on this date, I assisted Detective Elton with the controlled purchase of three Percocet (Oxycodone) pills with the use of a police operative (PO). The suspect involved in this case has been identified as Tarra Denelle Denton, DOB: 11/19/1977. Prior to the deal, the PO told Detective Elton and me that he/she expected Denton to be in her grey Honda Odyssey van during the drug transaction.

Prior to the "controlled buy", Detective Elton and I met with the PO at a pre-determined, secure location. At that time, I searched the PO's vehicle. During that search, I did not locate any illegal contraband or cash. I did not observe it, but was told by Detective Elton that he searched the PO's person. While at the secure location, the PO called Tarra Denton and arranged the purchase of 3 15 mg Percocet pills for \$60.00. During that conversation Denton told the PO to meet her at a parking lot near "Big-O Tires" on Kitsap Way.

I followed the PO to the area of Kitsap Way and when we got to the area of McDonald's, I was contacted by Detective Elton who told me that Denton had changed the location of the deal and it was set to occur in the Taco Bell parking lot. The Taco Bell is located at 3320 Kitsap Way, Bremerton, Washington. I turned my vehicle around in the area of Kitsap Way and National Avenue and as I did, I lost sight of the PO. I then traveled to the Taco Bell parking lot, where I set up surveillance on the parking lot. Detective Elton had taken over surveillance of the PO during this time.

Moments later, I observed the PO arrive in the Taco Bell parking lot and park. While we waited in this lot, I observed a 1999 Toyota Corolla, bearing Washington license: AEF5940, park directly behind my car. (I later ran this license plate and it comes back registered to This car was occupied by two younger looking females (approximately 17-19 years of age). At one point, the passenger exited this vehicle and walked into the Taco Bell for a moment and then exited within a minute or two and got back into this vehicle. The vehicle was parked there for at least 10 to fifteen minutes and never moved. I thought this was suspicious because they never went in to get food and appeared to be there waiting for something other than food. I suspected they were there to purchase drugs and I relayed this information to Detective Elton.

Shortly thereafter, I observed another vehicle (a red, 1994, Toyota Camry, bearing Washington license: 037TCX) (I later ran this license plate and it comes back registered to arrive in the parking lot and park deeper in the lot. This car was occupied by at least two younger females (approximately 17-19 years of age) and a medium sized, brown dog.

At approximately 1723 hours, I observed a grey, 2009, Honda Odyssey, bearing Washington license: 532ZCH, park near the PO's vehicle. (I later ran this license plate and it comes back registered to 8A 1) I then observed the PO exit his/her vehicle and walk over to the passenger side of Tarra Denton's van and get in. While the PO was in Denton's vehicle, a white female exited the red Toyota Camry (described above) and walked over to the driver's side of Tarra Denton's van. I could see this female reach into the vehicle at least two different times and I suspected

she was purchasing controlled substances from Tarra at this point. Within about a minute, this female

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walked away from Tarra Denton's van and approached the passenger side of the 1999 Toyota Corolla that had parked directly behind my vehicle. I then observed this female reach into the passenger compartment of this vehicle as if she was handing something to the passenger. The female then returned to her car.

At about the same time, the PO exited Denton's van and returned to his/her car. At approximately 1727 hours, Tarra Denton backed out and exited the parking lot followed by the PO and the two additional cars that I had described earlier.

I radioed this information to Detective Elton who ultimately followed the PO back to a secure location. After clearing the Taco Bell parking lot, I went to the secure location where I again searched the PO's vehicle.

This time, during the search of the PO's car, I located a music cd (compact disk) case tucked between the passenger seat and the center console. I opened this case and located a small plastic baggie containing what is suspected to be one half of a 30 mg Percocet pill. I then immediately observed a piece of tin boil with burn marks and the remnants of what appeared to be another possible Percocet pill. This piece of tin foil was found on the passenger seat, but I believe it had fallen out of the cd case when I initially picked it up. This belief is based on the statement made by the PO when questioned about these items that both items had been in the cd case. It is my belief that these items were in fact in the vehicle during my first search, before the controlled buy, but that I simply did not find them during that search.

I showed the PO the baggie containing half of a pill and the piece of tin foil with suspected Percocet residue and burn marks on it and asked him/her about it. The PO told Detective Elton and me that these items had been in the car previous to our controlled buy and that he/she did not purchase the pill from Tarra Denton. The PO indicated he/she had simply forgotten about the items. Detective Elton advised the PO that he was going to take custody of the pill and paraphernalia and place the items into evidence. I turned these two items of evidence over to Detective Elton at that time, for placement into the evidence system. Detective Elton ultimately did place these two items into evidence under BPD case number B11-009106, item #1 (bag with skulls printed on it containing one hald of a 30 mg Percocet pill) and item #2 (foil with Percocet residue on it).

The three pills that the PO had purchased from Terra Denton, on this date, were placed into evidence by Detective Elton under this case number (B11-009105, item #B1).

In researching Tarra Denton in a Bremerton Police Department records system (ILEADS), I found that on August 31st, 2011, Tarra Denton was the victim of what appears to be a home invasion robbery. This robbery was documented under BPD report B11-008414. The robbery occurred at 2503 Baymont Place, Bremerton, Washington. During the robbery the suspects stole 360 Vicoden pills and approximately \$2,500.00 in cash, along with her grey "Coach" purse that contained a white I-phone, a Bank of America debit card, a Washington State driver's license, and approximately \$300.00 cash. The PO in this case had indicated that Tarra Denton lived in the area of N. Cambrian Avenue, or somewhere near there. It should be noted that Baymont Place is near the 2400 to 2600 block of N. Lafayette Avenue which is very near N. Cambrian Avenue. Additionally, the PO in this case indicated Denton was living there with her boyfriend, who is a black male, but did not know his name. While I was reviewing this case, I noted that during the interview of Denton, she indicated she was living there with an individual by the name of Isaac Miller. Isaac Miller was fully identified as Isaac Shandon Miller, DOB: 11/15/1982 and happens to be a black male.

This concludes my involvement in this operation.

INFORMATION/VENUE: On 9/27/11, I was working as a Detective assigned to the Bremerton Police Department's Special Operations' Group ("SOG"). On this date, I assisted Detective Elton with a controlled purchase of narcotics involving a confidential informant ("CI"). Detective Elton advised that Tarra Denton was the suspect in his investigation.

ACTIONS: Prior to conducting the buy, Detective Elton and I met with the CI at a secure location. I searched the CI's vehicle; no contraband was located. I followed the CI to Taco Bell on Kitsap Way where he/she arranged to meet with Denton. A few minutes later, I learned from Detective Elton that the meeting place had been changed to McDonalds.

I pulled into the McDonald's parking lot after the CI. I observed the CI walk to a black Jeep bearing the license plate 556UTW. The CI got inside the jeep, remained there for a few minutes and then returned to his/her vehicle. The Jeep left the parking lot, and was last seen in the area of Rocky Point Rd and Jackson. I performed a records' check that showed the vehicle returns to 8A and 8A with an 8A address. I-leads shows that Reanna Brown (6/9/89) was recently stopped in the vehicle. I-leads indicates that Brown, who has a history of narcotics use involving pills, lives at 1904 Marine Dr. It should be noted that this address is approximately mile from the area where the vehicle was last seen.

Following the buy, I met Detective Elton and the CI in a secure location. Detective Elton provided me with two round green pills bearing the inscription A 214 packaged in a cigarette wrapper. I took custody of the pills, and placed them into evidence pursuant to department procedure. A check of drugs.com showed that the pills were 15 mg oxycodone hydrochloride, a schedule 2 narcotic.

On 09/29/2011 at about 1700 hours I responded to 2503 Baymont Place to assist Special Operations Group Detective Elton with a search warrant that he was executing under case number B11-009105.

Upon arrival Det. Elton requested that I transport Tarra Denton to the KCSO jail. Denton was already in hand restraints when I arrived. Before I placed Denton in the back seat of my patrol vehicle I conducted a search of her person. Denton was wearing a loose fitting blouse with no pockets, black-colored nylon stretch pants, and open toed sandals. I checked the front and back pockets of Denton's pants and along her waist line. I did not locate any items on Denton's person.

Prior to the execution of the search warrant Det. Elton advised that Denton is know to carry drugs and items tucked into her bra and underwear.

I transported Denton to the KCSO jail. Upon arrival I observed as Kitsap County Corrections Officer S. Slipper conducted a pat down search of Denton in the intake lobby of the booking area at the jail. I advised Corrections Officer Slipper that Det. Elton requested that a strip search be conducted of Denton's person. Corrections Ofc. Slipper escorted Denton to the private room to conduct the search. After a short time Ofc. Slipper exited the private room and advised myself and jail staff that Denton was swallowing something. Jail staff confronted Denton and I could hear her denying that she had swallowed anything. Due to the fact that Denton swallowed unknown items she was escorted to a crisis holding cell.

Corrections Officer Slipper advised that while Denton was undressing Denton had her back facing Ofc. Slipper's direction. Ofc. Slipper was did not see Denton put anything into her mouth nor did she see any contraband while Denton was removing her clothing. Ofc. Slipper advised that when she asked Denton to open her mouth for a standard mouth check Denton refused to open and lower her mouth while she pointed her face upwards. Ofc. Slipper advised that it appeared as if Denton was holding something inside her mouth. Ofc. Slipper said that Denton then began repeatedly swallowing and lowered her head where she continued swallowing the unknown item.

INFORMATION/VENUE: On 9/29/11, I was working as a Detective with the Bremerton Police Department's Special Operations' Group ("SOG"). On this date, I took part in a search warrant executed at 2503 Baymont Pl in Bremerton. Detective Elton, who served as the case agent for the warrant, advised that the target was Tarra Denton. Detective Elton had probable cause to arrest Denton for delivery of a scheduled narcotic.

SAFETY BRIEFING: Prior to executing the warrant, Detective Elton conducted a pre-operational safety briefing at the SOG Office. During the safety briefing Detective Elton provided background information regarding the case, and reviewed the plan for executing the warrant. Each entry team member was present for the briefing, and given a specific assignment. I was assigned to handle the shield, and perform the announcement.

WARRANT EXECUTION: While other units staged for the warrant, Detective Musselwhite took a position of surveillance near the residence. When Detective Musselwhite observed Denton return to the residence, we responded to serve the warrant.

Detective Musselwhite detained Denton by her vehicle while other entry team members moved to the basement door on the S/W side of the residence. As I approached the door, I drew my handgun. I did so because I know from my training and experience that the execution of narcotics' related search warrants are inherently dangerous. Drug dealers often use weapons to avoid apprehension.

I knocked on the door, and announced loudly that we were with the Bremerton Police Department, and serving a search warrant. As I knocked with my foot, the door, which had not been securely shut, swung open. We stayed outside, continuing to announce our presence and instructing anyone inside to come out. After a few moments, three females exited the residence, and were passed off to other officers. I then entered the residence with others behind me, and cleared it room by room.

After clearing the residence of people, I assisted with searching it. I focused on the bathroom, and laundry room. I discovered a zip-lock baggie in the bathroom trashcan that contained trace amounts of a green leafy substance. From my training and experience, I immediately recognized the substance as marijuana. I subsequently NIK tested the substance, which was positive for marijuana. I also discovered an unmarked RX bottle in a blue box next to the washing machine that contained 21 greenish blue elliptical pills with the inscription 2089 V. I subsequently looked up the pills on Drugs.com, and determined that they were Alprozolam, a schedule 4 narcotic. It should be noted that there was women's' clothing in the vicinity of the box. Two 9 mm bullets were discovered with women's' make-up accessories in the laundry room. The bullets were left on scene. The other listed items were placed into evidence per department procedure. I took digital photos of the residence and collected items, which were transferred to CD and placed into evidence. This ended my involvement.










Ono 9/29/2011 I was on duty and assigned to the Special Operations Group of the Bremerton Police Department. The Special Operations Group arrested Tarra D. Denton outside of her home at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton at about 1658 hrs. I had probable cause to arrest her based on a series of operations wherein she agreed to provide a police operative with prescription pills in exchange for money or other negotiable instruments during the month of September 2011.

The operative in this case is working with the Bremerton Police Department in order to receive a favorable recommendation on pending theft charges. The operative also reported that their addiction to prescription drugs has landed them in the position they are in currently and expressed interest in assisting me and SOG with narcotics investigations they had the ability to complete with drug dealers in the Kitsap County area. The operative has further shown credibility through their own admissions against their interest. The operative has demonstrated a current and accurate knowledge of prescription pill, and Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet) prices, based on their own experiences. The operative was able to accurately describe to me the different drug packaging methods, methods of drug use, and the process of doing illicit drug deals, which are in line with my experiences as a narcotics detective and police officer since 1997. The operative has shown reliability through the completion of controlled substance purchases. I have completed 7 controlled purchases of prescription pills from three different dealers in the area with the assistance of this operative and detectives from the Bremerton police department. The operative in this case has no criminal history at this time.

Denton was arrested after she arrived at the Baymont address in a silver Dodge Avenger (Budget Rental car) with WA plate # ADY9372 (about 1658 hrs). She had exited and was manipulating something that was in the open trunk when Det. Musselwhite approached her. He was wearing police equipment and marking that said "POLICE". She guickly shut the trunk when she heard and then saw him. She was placed into restraints that were double locked and checked for fit.

I had a search warrant for the lower portion of the house where it was determined that Denton was residing (filed under #20110346). The warrant was authorized by Kitsap County Superior Court Judge M. K. Haberly on the morning of 9/29/2011. I had secured a warrant previous to this that covered the whole house at 2503 Baymont Plc.

Once Denton was arrested other detectives from SOG moved towards the lower portion of 2503 Baymont (Det. Whatley, Det. Heffernan, Det. Musselwhite and I). The team members were all wearing police equipment and patches identifying them as "POLICE". They were wearing these marking and police equipment so that they could be easily identified. They were carrying duty weapons out and ready in case of an armed confrontation. It is known that drug dealers often carry weapons to aid in avoiding apprehension and to guard themselves against rip-offs. Ofc. Inklebarger arrived and assisted at the house as well. While knocking and announcing their presence at the door to the lower portion of the residence the team encountered three females; Maliaka Angevine, Sarah Gatchalian, and her mother, Rosalinda Frazer.

Malaika indentified herself as Malaika Angevine verbally. Malaika is the associate of Denton's who completed some of the deals with the police operative in this case, which Denton arranged each time. The arrest of Malaika was based on probable cause developed during the investigation of Denton and her drug

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dealing endeavors.

I advised Malaika of her Miranda warnings, and I explained why she was arrested. She denied selling any drugs, admitted to smoking marijuana, and using one 5mg Vicodin pill on one occasion. I told her that I watched her meeting with the informant on more than one occasion and she changed her story slightly. She said that she has driven Denton to location where Denton sold drugs. Angevine said she wanted to speak to an attorney, and was then transported to the jail where she was booked for Delivery of a Controlled Substance (schedule 2 prescription drugs - Percocet).

I interviewed Gathalian and her mother, Frazer. Gatchalian said she was friends with Malaika and Denton, but denied being there to buy or sell illicit drugs. She said that she had been in drug court and did not complete the program. She said she was a previous abuser of prescription drugs, but again denied being involved in drug deals with Denton or Malaika. Frazer is elderly and terminally ill per Gatchalian. She denied any involvement in illicit drug use, buying or dealing. She said she had no idea what Denton was involved in. Gatchalian and Frazer were released from the scene.

I then interviewed Denton after advising her of her Miranda warnings. She admitted to abusing prescription pills, she admitted to using meth, and marijuana. She said she has a medical marijuana card in her purse, which was on the trunk of the car she was arrested at. She also told me and other officers there was marijuana in the purse. This bag was visible through the open top of the purse near her. I noticed a baggie containing 3 pills in it on the ground at Denton's feet. These pills are similar to the ones purchased from Denton during this investigation. I recognized these pills to be Oxycodone Hydrochloride based on their appearance. I picked them up and they were later placed into the BPD property room. Denton was reluctant to discuss her part in selling drugs and asked to have her attorney present before she would speak about this further. She was placed into a patrol car and later transported to the jail.

Based on the investigation, and probable cause developed to arrest Denton and Malaika for delivery, and the fact that drug dealers carry items related to drug dealing on them or in their cars, I asked Ofc. Glasgow to apply his narcotics K9 to the exterior of the car she arrived in. I could actually see what appeared to be leafy marijuana residue on the back seat and floor board of the car as I looked into it through the windows. I asked Ofc. Glasgow to search the exterior of the van that had been used in the drug deals as well (WA# 532 ZCH). The van was parked next to where Denton parked the Avenger. Ofc. Glasgow applied K9 Lance to the exterior of the Dodge Avenger (WA# ADY9372) and on the way to doing this Lance gave a positive alert to the purse that Denton had been in possession of at the time of her arrest. Ofc. Glasgow continued the application and advised that Lance also gave a positive alert at the trunk seam on the Avenger (Lance's K9 resume is attached). I could smell the odor of marijuana coming from this area of the trunk when I put my nose to the area as well. I am familiar with the smell of marijuana and this is based on my years as a police officers since 1997 and about 5 years as a narcotics detective.

The car was towed to a locked and alarmed Bremerton Police Facility by Silverdale Towing in preparation for a search warrant. The purse was not search, and it was placed into the BPD property room in preparation for a search warrant as well.

SOG detective's took photographs of the residence and completed a search. Items seized from the house were described on a property sheet. A copy of this sheet was left on scene with the warrant, and inventories (copies attached). Drug paraphernalia items were located in the house (meth and marijuana pipes with residue), along with 21 Lorazepam pills (identified by Det. Heffernan), 23 white pills in a bag (found by Det. Whatley, the boxes that had contained the perfume and straightener traded to Denton for Percocet during deal #4, and small amount of marijuana. Paper documents were located in the house too showing dominion and control of the area by Denton. Drug notes and ledgers were also located during the warrant inside the house.

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I completed a probable cause statement for the arrest of Denton and Angevine, which were faxed to the prosecutor (see both attached).

On 9/30/11 I secured another search warrant through Kitsap County Judge M. K. Haberly. She authorized warrant #20110349 for the search of Denton's Coach purse, and the silver Dodge Avenger bearing WA# ADY9372 and VIN: 1B3BD4FB6BN551585. This warrant was received based on a new complaint and the information developed through my investigation, Denton's arrest and the K9 search of these items that occurred on 9/30/11.

Once the warrant was authorized and filed I went to the BPD property room to retrieve the purse (item A2). I checked this item out and received a receipt for doing so (see attached). I took the purse to the location where the Avenger was secured at. I searched the car and the purse with the assistance of Det. Whatley. Photos were taken during the search. I searched the purse and located the following items of evidence; 2 bags of marijuana in her purse (40 grams total weight), notes ledgers and paperwork showing ownership by Denton was located in the purse, there was a Budget Rental car agreement located with Denton's AKA of Lawson on it in the car as well. I located an AWS digital scale in the purse that was operable, and 18 yellow oval shaped pills with the marking Watson 853 on them located in a small container that had "chill pills" printed on the lid. These were confirmed to be Acetaminophen and hydrocodone bitartrate, and located in the trunk of the car as well. 21 white rectangle shaped pills were located in the purse inside of an orange container with a white cap. They were marked with M and 57/71 and confirmed to be Methadone hydrochloride 10 mg (see attached). Her purse also contained 8 six sided pills marked N8 with a symbol or picture of a sword on them. These were confirmed to be Suboxone. I also located 2 pills that were white and round in shape and marked with M4. These are suspected to be Hydromorphone Hydrochloride, or Acetaminophen and Codeine Phosphate. These both require a prescription to possess. I seized two phones from her purse as well; a Nokia and an Apple I phone. I also seized \$393 in cash from her purse. She is not employed, and her sole source of income is dealing pills based on my investigation.

The car was searched and the following items of evidence were seized from the vehicle; 11 individual bags of marijuana (179 grams combined weight) were located in the trunk inside of black bag with 2 straps and multicolored paisleys on it. This bag also contained other bags that had contained marijuana at one time, packaging materials in a box, and smaller bags with red print in another bag, there were 4 packets of Spice, and a black digital scale in there as well.

I searched a black case with silver accents that was located in the trunk too. It contained a 32 caliber Kel Tec semi-automatic handgun that was wrapped in a black cloth. It was with a magazine that fit the gun, which was loaded with 6 hollow point bullets. The serial number was checked and found to be a locally reported stolen gun, serial #73855 (B11-007599). I contacted the gun owner who reported it stolen on August 7th 2011. He confirmed it was still stolen and he was advised that we recovered it during the service of a search warrant. I advised Casady that he would be able to recover it when the prosecutor determined the gun was no longer needed for evidentiary reasons. There were other items in this black case as well. There was a clear box with a purple lid on it containing 23 oval shaped pills marked with Watson 853 on them. They were confirmed to be Acetaminophen and hydrocodone bitartrate allowed to be possessed only with prescription. There was a pill bottle located in this box that was issued to Kyle Young (per label) and the prescription was for Acetaminophen and hydrocodone bitartrate. It contained 15 white oval shaped pills marked with V and 35/92. These also also Acetaminophen and hydrocodone bitartrate.

I located a small silver carry case and it contained a broken glass meth pipe with signs of use within it. I located a red pouch with a zipper in the trunk too. It contained a glass methamphetamine pipe and it contained residue. It contained small containers that had meth residue in them too. This bag also carried a black film

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container with two small bags of methamphetamine in them. The meth from one of these bags was tested with a narcotics identification kit and it revealed a positive result for the presence of meth.

I located a pill bottle issued to Jesse Byron for Suboxone in the back seat area of the interior of the car. It contained no pills. I located and photographed leafy substance on the floor and seats of the car. It appeared to be marijuana based on my training and experience.

I left a copy of the warrant, inventories and property sheets in the purse and a copy in the car as well. I took photos of these forms in these places.

On 10/1/11 I asked Det. Musselwhite to fax a new probable cause statement to the jail for the new PC charges against Denton. I forwarded a narrative regarding the PC for the new charges of; Possession of a Controlled Substance with Intent to Deliver (marijuana), Possession of a Stolen Firearm, and Felon in Possession of a Firearm. The bail was set at \$75,000 for the new charges (see statement attached).

This concluded my involvement in this case through 10/1/11.

On 9/22/11 I was on duty and assigned to the Special Operations Group. I conducted a controlled buy operation with the assistance of another SOG detective (Det. Whatley) and a police operative. I was with the operative when they made a call to Tarra Denton and arranged for the purchase of 2 Percocet pills (a schedule 2 prescription drug).

I met with Det. Whatley and the operative prior to the buy. I searched the operative and Det. Whatley searched the operative's car there. We located nothing of consequence during these searches. During the conversation with Denton (on speaker phone) I heard Denton tell the operative that she would not sell them any pills because the operative would not "boost" for her. She wanted the operative to steal merchandise from stores. The operative told her that they were afraid of getting caught and asked her to sell the pills at a higher then normal price. Denton refused and told the operative that they needed to get her "stuff" from Fred Meyer on the east side of Bremerton. She went on to tell the operative that she had bags waiting for her at Fred Meyer under the name Tina Dennis. She said that she wanted the operative to go to Fred Meyer to pick up the bags. He refused and again asked for the pills at a higher price. She ultimately agreed to sell the Percocet to the operative for \$40 a piece. This is higher than the normal street value of \$30 to \$35 each. Denton told the operative that Malaika (last name Angevine), would meet them near Chip's Casino on Wheaton Way. When the call ended I asked the operative about the bags at Fred Meyer. The operative told me that Denton expected him to asked for the bags from Fred Meyer staff, act as if they were going to pay for the merchandise in the bags and then run from the store with the bags without paying. Denton would then trade Percocet for the stolen items.

I provided the operative with \$80 in pre-recorded SOG funds at this location which consisted of 4 \$20 bills. The serial numbers were copied into my notebook and then transferred to this report, and they were; CE49126787D, EF58667544B, ED31647304A, and EC91022638F.

The operative was followed to the deal location. Det. Whatley parked in the lot with the operative in view during surveillance. I was parked in the lot as well, but east of them with the operative in view.

At about at about 1653 hrs, I observed the van Denton had arrived in during buy #1. This van came n/b on Wheaton Way and turned onto Riddell, the van then turned into the parking lot where the operative and Det. Whatley were waiting. The van passed by the front of my car and I recognized the driver as Malaika from a past buy arranged by Denton. The van parked near the operative and the operative entered the van (bearing WA# 532ZCH). The operative entered the van and was inside for a very short period of time (estimated one minute). The operative exited and re-entered their car. The operative left the deal location and was followed to the post-buy meeting where the operative would again meet with Det. Whatley and I. The van left the lot w/b on Riddell.

Det. Whatley and I followed the operative away from the deal location and we met with the operative at the post-buy location where the operative and their vehicle were again searched. Nothing of consequence was located during these searches. The operative provided me with 2 pills (Percocet). They were marked with K9 on one, blue and round in shape. I confirmed that these pills are Oxycodone Hydrochloride (see attached).

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I asked the operative what happened during the meeting. The operative said that Denton was not in the van and Malaika was the sole occupant. The operative said that the female was provided with the SOG funds and then she handed the operative the Percocet pills which she retrieved from a pocket on her jacket or shirt. The operative said that they exited the van when the deal was done.

I placed the pill into the property room after completing the post-buy meeting with the operative.

This concludes my involvement in this case through 9/22/11.





On 9/29/2011, I was working as a Detective with the Bremerton Police Department's Special Operations Group. On this date I assisted Det. Elton the execution of a drug related search warrant at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton, WA.

Prior to the execution of this warrant, Det. Heffernan and I were asked to attempt to approach the residence from the rear in order to gather intelligence about the possible entrances into the house. Research into the suspect, Tarra Denton, and her associates led us to believe that Denton was renting the basement of the residence from a friend. It was believed that Denton had her own entrance into the residence that was separate from the entrance used by the people living on the main floor of the house. In an attempt to determine the best entry point for the basement of the residence, Det. Heffernan and I approached the residence from a wooded area to the west of the house.

We approached the residence covertly and I was able to observe the rear of the house. I noticed that there were two doors that appeared to go into the basement of the residence. The residence was designed with a daylight basement that was accessed only in the rear of the house. I also noticed that there appeared to be a male in the back yard as we approached. The male did not walk around the residence to the main floor entrance, which led me to believe that he entered the residence through one of the rear doors. Det. Heffernan and I did not remain in our position for very long based on the fact that we were too close to egress without being observed if someone walked to the edge of the wooded area.

I was able to identify two possible points of entry for the basement of the residence based on this surveillance. I provided this information to Det. Elton prior to the service of the warrant.

BRIEFING:

With the updated information, Det. Elton conducted a pre-operational safety briefing. During this briefing Det. Elton covered the details surrounding the investigation and gave each SOG member an assignment. I was assigned to conduct surveillance of the residence prior to the service of the warrant. I would also serve as a member of entry team, including mechanically breaching the door if no answer was received after a reasonable amount of time. Det. Elton advised that there was probable cause to arrest Tarra Denton and another white female named "Malika" for Delivery of a Controlled Substance. Both suspects were believed to be living at 2503 Baymont Place.

Our plan was to make entry through the basement and detain anyone located in that part of the residence. We would then determine the level of access between the basement and the main part of the residence. In the event that there was unimpeded access between the upper and lower levels of the residence, we would continue upstairs and conduct a sweep of the main floor of the residence for people. This protective sweep was thought to be necessary for the safety of the SOG Detectives who would be searching the basement for evidence. There was also evidence to suggest that the residents of the upstairs part of the house were close friends of Denton's, which suggested that they could be involved in the illegal drug distribution.

Our approach and all contacts in the residence were planned to be made with our duty weapons drawn. This

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is due to the fact that drug related search warrants are inherently dangerous, based my training and experience as a police officer and SOG Detective. It is commonly known that people involved in trafficking and distribution of illegal drugs routinely arm themselves with dangerous weapons such as firearms, knives, and blunt objects. It is also common for such people to use these weapons against others in an attempt to protect their drugs and money from theft and/or against law enforcement in an attempt to avoid arrest.

SURVEILLANCE:

At approximately 1510 hours I took up a position of surveillance at a residence just north of 2503 Baymont Pl. I could see Denton's grey Honda Odyssey parked at the end of Baymont Pl. I did not see the Jeep Cherokee or the silver Dodge Avenger, which had been the last two vehicles Denton was known to use. Just after I arrived, I observed a black male and a white female leaving the carport in a dark orange colored passenger car. I was aware that the people who lived in the main level of the residence were the owners of this vehicle. I informed Det. Elton that it appeared as though the upstairs tenants were leaving the residence. Other SOG members and patrol officers were in the area waiting to serve the warrant until there was an indication that Denton was present.

At approximately 1600 hrs I observed two males arrive at the residence in a white Nissan Sentra. I relayed this information, including the license plate, to Det. Elton. The two males (one black male and one Asian / Pacific Islander male) walked around to the rear of the residence. A short time later two females were dropped off at the residence, both of whom also walked around to the rear of the residence. These two females arrived in a maroon Toyota passenger car. I relayed this information to Det. Elton as well. A few minutes after the two females were dropped off at the residence I observed the two males getting back into the white Nissan Sentra. The males were accompanied by two children, a boy and girl who appeared to be approximately 6 to 10 years old. The two males and the two children left the area in the white Sentra. I relayed this information to Det. Elton.

At approximately 1655 hours I observed the silver Dodge Avenger approaching the residence. I could see that Denton was driving the vehicle. I recognized Denton from a recent DOL photo that Det. Elton presented during the pre-operational briefing.

I alerted the other units that Denton had arrived. I decided that it would be safer and more beneficial to the investigation to take Denton into custody as she was exiting her vehicle, rather than allow her to enter the residence.

IN CUSTODY:

I pulled my unmarked vehicle up behind Denton's just as she was exiting the Dodge Avenger. Denton opened the trunk of the car and was manipulating something in the trunk as I made contact with her. I was wearing a protective vest that was clearly marked with the word "Police." Due to the fact that I could not see Denton's hands while she was at the trunk of the car, I un-holstered my duty weapon, identified myself as "Bremerton Police," and I instructed her to show me her hands. Denton complied with my instructions. Denton closed the lid of the trunk as she turned around to face me with her hands up.

I removed Denton's purse from her left arm and took control of both of her arms. As I was taking Denton into custody I could smell the obvious odor of what I recognized as marijuana, based on my training and experience as police officer and SOG Detective. I advised Denton that she was under arrest for Delivery of a Controlled Substance. I placed her into hand restraints that were checked for fit and double locked. Denton was wearing a brace on her right wrist at the time. I used two interlocked sets of cuffs to prevent putting too much pressure on Denton's wrist in the event that it was injured.

ENTRY MADE:

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Sgt. Plumb and the rest of the SOG entry team arrived. I left Denton in Sgt. Plumb's custody as Det. Heffernan, Det. Whatley, and I made contact at the residence. Prior to entering the basement I knocked on the front door of the main level in order to attempt to contact anyone in that part of the residence. No answer was received upstairs. We then went to the rear of the residence and prepared to serve the search warrant on the basement. Det. Heffernan attempted to knock on the door with his foot. When Det. Heffernan's foot hit the door, the door swung open due to the fact that it was not latched closed. We stood outside the door and announced loudly that we were the Police with a search warrant. We called loudly for anyone inside the residence to come out with their hands up. It should be noted that I could smell the obvious odor of marijuana as I stood outside the open door, based on my training and experience as a police officer.

Det. Whatley advised that he could see at least one female in the residence. Three females emerged from the basement of the residence and were detained outside of the residence. I asked the females how many more people were inside the residence and one of them said, "No more people are here." We entered the basement at this time and cleared it of people. We noticed there was a stairway that led to the upper level of the main residence. There was an open door leading to the stairway. Due to the fact that access between the upper and lower floors of the house was completely unimpeded, we cleared the upper floor of the house of people as well.

After the house was found to be clear of people, Det. Heffernan took overall photographs of the basement. After these photographs were taken, we began to search the basement of the residence for evidence in accordance with Det. Elton's search warrant.

SEARCH OF BASEMENT:

While searching the basement I located what appeared to be a baggy of methamphetamine (Item SW 1), based on my training and experience. This baggy was located on a table behind a flat screen television. I also located an electric Conair curling brush (Item SW 7) on a shelf above the bed that was still in the box, which I recognized as evidence of one of Det. Elton's controlled buys. Det. Elton had purchased the curling brush and a bottle of perfume prior to his last controlled buy and traded the two items for pills. On a table in the middle of the basement I located a black Samsung cell phone (Item SW 12). This phone was taken so that it could be forensically examined. On the same table I located a Dell laptop computer (Item SW 14), which was also taken to be forensically examined.

I assisted Det. Whatley and Det. Heffernan with the packaging and labeling of the evidence collected in the basement. This evidence was later entered into our property system by Det. Whatley.

On 9/27/2011, I was working as a Detective with the Bremerton Police Department's Special Operations Group. On this date I assisted Det. Elton with a controlled buy of prescription medication using a confidential informant.

I was briefed prior to the buy and asked to conduct close surveillance of the suspect's residence. The suspect, Tarra Denton, was said to reside at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton, WA. I was asked to position myself near the residence so that I could monitor the traffic to and from the residence during the controlled buy.

At approximately 1700 hrs I took up a position of surveillance at a residence just north of 2503 Baymont Place. I was able to observe a silver Dodge passenger car, a dark colored Jeep Cherokee, a grey Honda Odyssey, a white Mercury Cougar, and an early model grey Buick parked at the residence. After several minutes I noticed the silver Dodge, the white Mercury, and the Jeep Cherokee all leave the residence at approximately the same time. I alerted Det. Elton of the activity.

I observed a white female driver and white female passenger in the Jeep Cherokee as it passed my location. I also noticed a black male driver in the white Mercury. I could not see the driver of the silver Dodge.

At approximately 1810 hrs I observed the Jeep Cherokee and the silver Dodge arriving back at the residence. I was able to observe the two white females exiting the Jeep and walking back to the residence of 2503 Baymont Place. The females walked around the carport on the south side of the residence as if they were going to the rear of the residence. I alerted Det. Elton of this, After several minutes I left the area. As I was leaving, the white Mercury passed me on its way back up Baymont Place towards the suspect residence.

On 9/27/11 I was on duty and assigned to the Special Operations Group. I conducted an investigation wherein Percocet pills were delivered to a police operative. This was completed with the assistance of SOG detectives (Det. Whatley, Sgt. Plumb, Det. Musselwhite, Det. Heffernan) and a police operative.

I met the operative at a pre-buy location with Det. Heffernan. I searched the operative and Det. Heffernan searched the operative's car there. We located nothing of consequence during these searches.

Det. Whatley was in the area of Denton's home at 2503 Baymont Plc. He gave periodic updates while on surveillance. He was able to run a plate on a silver Dodge Avenger (WA# ADY9372). This returned to a holding company, which I know are commonly how rental cars are registered. He advised that another car came and went a few times and the occupants actually waved at him once.

The operative made contact with Denton via cell phone and I heard the conversation over the operative's speaker phone. During the conversation with Denton the operative told her that they had some of the specific items she requested from Fred Meyer. She had asked the operative to "boost" some perfume, some size 5 jeans and a hair straightener that cost \$59.99 prior to this investigation. The operative told her what they had to trade to her for the pills (Juicy Couture perfume and the hair straightener). Denton said that she couldn't talk right then because she thought she was about to "get raided" and then hung up. The decision was made to put the deal off because of Tarra's suspicion, and the possibility that she or her associates had seen Det. Whatley on surveillance at the house.

A few hours later the operative called me and advised that Denton had called back wanting to do the deal we intended to do earlier. I asked Det. Musselwhite to take over surveillance on Baymont in order to keep Det. Whatley's vehicle out of that area due to the concern that he was compromised there. Det. Musselwhite arrived there at about 1700 hrs.

I met with the operative at a secure location prior to the buy. I was with Det. Heffernan at this location. Det. Heffernan searched the operatives' car and I searched the operative. Nothing of consequence was located during these searches. I was present with the operative who called Denton. I listened to their conversation over speaker phone and heard Denton arranging to meet the operative at the Taco Bell on Kitsap Way. I sent surveillance units to the Taco Bell at this time. Det. Whaltley, and Sgt. Plumb were set up in the area of Taco Bell to watch for the arrival of Denton and the operative.

I provided the operative with the perfume and straightener, which were photographed prior to the meeting (see attached). Once the searches were done and the operative was provided with the merchandise to trade Denton for Percocet Det. Heffernan was sent to Taco Bell to assist with surveillance. I followed the operative to the buy location at the Kitsap Way Taco Bell. I was across the street from Taco Bell on Wilbert Ave. Det. Musselwhite called and told me that several cars left the Baymont location at the same time. One was a silver car, one was described as a dark colored Jeep Cherokee. The operative was at Taco Bell a few minutes before calling me and telling me that Denton called and changed their meeting location to the McDonalds on Kitsap Way (a short distance from Taco Bell).

I advised surveillance units of the change in locations and the vehicles seen leaving the Baymont address. I also warned of the possibility that Denton would be using counter surveillance due to the multiple cars leaving Baymont at the time that this deal was supposed to occur. Surveillance units moved to the area of McDonald's in preparation for the operative and suspect's arrival.

The operative moved to McDonalds and shortly after this I saw a dark colored Jeep Cherokee coming from Corbet (s/b) and turning onto Kitsap Way w/b towards the McDonalds. Det. Heffernan was inside the McDonalds on surveillance, I moved across the street from McDonalds and saw the arrival of the dark colored Jeep Cherokee. Surveillance units were able to provide a plate for that Jeep (WA# 556UTW), a black 1998 Jeep Cherokee, registered to 8A and 8A in Bremerton WA. I could see the operative's car parked in the parking lot to the rear of where the Jeep parked (facing the McDonald's play area). I saw the operative exiting their car with the perfume and straightener and walking towards the Jeep. The operative entered the jeep on the driver's side sitting behind the driver. The operative was in the Jeep for a few minutes until I saw the operative exiting the Jeep without the merchandise they arrived with. The operative returned to their car and left the lot with Det. Whatley and I following. The Jeep left the lot w/b on Kitsap and surveillance units remaining at the scene were tasked with following that suspect car from the lot to it's next location.

Surveillance units lost the Jeep at Rocky Point and Jackson Ave. Records indicate that this vehicle is owned by a woman who lives within a mile of that area. Det. Musselwhite called me minutes after the Jeep was lost. He was still on surveillance at the Baymont address. He advised that the Jeep had returned to the Baymont address and that two female exited it walking towards the house, and around the end of the carport towards the back of the house.

Det. Heffernan and I met with the operative at the post-buy location where they handed me 2 Percocet pills. They were marked with a symbol similar to an "R" and 214. They were confirmed to be Oxycodone Hydrochloride (see attached). I provided these to Det. Heffernan for later placement into the property room. I searched the operative and Det. Heffernan searched the operative's car locating nothing of consequence during these searches.

I asked the operative what happened during the meeting. The operative said that Denton was in the Jeep Cherokee that I saw arriving in the McDonald's lot. The operative said there was a female driver that they did not know. The operative said that Denton was provided with the merchandise that she was told were stolen items from Fred Meyers. The Juicy Couture perfume was actually still inside of a security device (clear with a tan base), in order to make it appear as if it was stolen. The operative said that Denton gave them one Percocet pill in exchange for the items. The operative said they asked for more due to the value of the items traded to Denton. Denton offered to give the operative some marijuana in addition to the pill and they operative refused the marijuana asking for more pills. Denton provided the operative with one more pill and the operative exited the van when the deal was done.

I presented the operative with a photo line up made up of six photographs. Denton's photo was one of the included photos. The operative was asked to identify anyone they recognized in the line up. They were advised that there might be no one in the line up that they knew. The operative was also asked not to try to identify anyone if they were no certain of the identification. I advised the operative that it was not an issue if they identified anyone from the photograph or not. The operative looked at the line up and immediately pointed to the photo of Denton. The operative said "that's Tarra" and commented about her disheveled appearance. The operative circled the photograph of Tarra Denton, initialed and dated it "9/27/11". (see line up attached)

This concludes my involvement in this case through 9/27/11.



On September 27th, 2011, I was working as the detective sergeant assigned to the Bremerton Police Department's Special Operations Group (SOG). Also on this date, I assisted Detective Elton with the controlled purchase of Percocet pills using a police operative (PO). My role in this operation was to assist with surveillance during and after the buy. The plan was to conduct a "follow-away" of the suspect after the controlled buy. This buy took place in the afternoon hours (daylight hours).

I was made aware that the suspect involved in this deal was Tarra Denton. Initially we were told to set up surveillance in the area of the Taco Bell on Kitsap Way. I set up surveillance in a parking lot to the west of the Taco Bell, but on the same side of the street (north side). While we waited for the suspect to arrive and after the PO had already parked in the Taco Bell parking lot, we were made aware of the deal location change. Detective Elton advised us that the location had changed to the McDonald's parking lot, which is a few businesses to the west of the Taco Bell, on the same side of the street.

I remained in my position, while other detectives moved into a position to be able to see the McDonald's parking lot. A short time later, we were advised by Detective Elton that a green or dark colored Jeep had arrived in the parking lot and that the PO was walking over to that vehicle. I was not able to observe any of this meeting from my vantage point. At the conclusion of the transaction, I was advised the suspect had left the lot traveling northbound on Morgan Road.

I quickly drove to the area of Rocky Point Road and Jackson Drive and waited. In less than a minute, I observed a dark colored Jeep traveling westbound on NW 18th Street at Jackson Drive. It appeared the vehicle was going to travel southbound on Rocky Point Road from Jackson Drive, so I ducked down in my car so as not to be seen by the suspects if they drove by my location. (I had pulled over to the west side of the road just south of Jackson Drive and NW 18th Street.) After waiting approximately 30 seconds, I did not see the vehicle drive by so I began checking the area for the vehicle but could not locate it.

I cleared surveillance. This concludes my involvement in this operation. Report with case file.

On 9/20/11 at about 1723 hrs, I was on duty and assigned to the Special Operations Group. I conducted a controlled purchase of 3 Oxycodone Hydrochloride pills (15mg each). These are a schedule 2 drug. The operation was completed with the assistance of Sgt. Plumb of SOG.

We met with the operative before and after the purchase. Sgt. Plumb searched the vehicle and I searched the operative at the pre and post-buy location. I located nothing of consequence during my searches. Nothing was located in the operative's car at the pre-buy search by Sgt. Plumb.

I was present with the operative when the suspect who was selling the pills was contacted via cell phone. I heard a female, whom I believe to be Tarra Denton, arranging to sell the operative three pills for the sum of \$60. The suspect agreed to meet with the operative at a parking lot on the north side of Kitsap Way between 11th and Marine Dr, within the City of Bremerton. The operative was provided with \$60 in pre-recorded SOG funds to make the purchase with. The serial numbers for the \$20 bills provided were copied into my notebook and then transferred to this report and they were; GE58925414A, GL13406476A, and IL506488905C.

The operative was then followed from the pre-buy search location to the deal location on Kitsap Way. I parked across the street waiting for the suspect's arrival. Sgt. Plumb parked in the lot where the operative was parked waiting for Denton to arrive. The operative had advised that Denton should arrive in a silver Honda mini-van. At about 1723 Denton arrived in a silver Honda mini-van bearing WA# 532 ZCH. This vehicle is registered to Denton but under the last name Lawson. I took photos of the van as it arrived at the deal location.

At the post-buy meeting the operative entered my car. While we debriefed the meeting with Denton Sgt. Plumb completed a search of the operative's car. The operative provided me with the purchased pills. There were three pills in a baggie. They were small and round and marked with a 214. With the markings on the pill I confirmed they were Oxycodone Hydrochloride (schedule 2). The operative said that Denton often keeps pills, marijuana and meth with her as she travels. The operative said that Denton retrieved the purchased pills from her bra and she was provided the SOG funds, which she placed in the console of her van. The operative said the female we observed at the driver's window was also buying pills from Denton. This female reported stood at the window, covertly dropped cash into the window which fell on the floorboard and Denton sold pills to the female too. I found nothing of consequence on the operative's person at the post buy search of his person.

During Sgt. Plumb's search of the operative's car he location a baggie containing half of a pills inside of a CD case. The baggie from the purchase and the baggie Sgt. Plumb located were not the same. Sgt. Plumb also located a piece of foil in the car with obvious signs of use to smoke pills on it. These items were placed into the BPD property room under case 11-009106. The operative said that they had forgotten that these were in the car and said that they had been there prior to the purchase with Denton today.

I placed the three pills that the PO had purchased from Terra Denton into evidence under this case number (B11-009105, item #B1).

Page:

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Sgt. Plumb learned the following about Tarra Denton through research;

On August 31st, 2011, Tarra Denton was the victim of what appears to be a home invasion robbery. This robbery was documented under BPD report B11-008414. The robbery occurred at 2503 Baymont Place, Bremerton, Washington. During the robbery the suspects stole 360 Vicoden pills and approximately \$2,500.00 in cash, along with her grey "Coach" purse that contained a white I-phone, a Bank of America debit card, a Washington State driver's license, and approximately \$300.00 cash. The PO in this case had indicated that Tarra Denton lived in the area of N. Cambrian Avenue, or somewhere near there. It should be noted that Baymont Place is near the 2400 to 2600 block of N. Lafayette Avenue which is very near N. Cambrian Avenue. Additionally, the PO in this case indicated Denton was living there with her boyfriend, who is a black male, but did not know his name. It was noted that during the 11-008414 interview of Denton, she indicated she was living there with an individual by the name of Isaac Miller. Isaac Miller was fully identified as Isaac Shandon Miller, DOB: 11/15/1982 and happens to be a black male.

On September 29th, 2011, I was working as the detective sergeant assigned to the Bremerton Police Department's Special Operations Group (SOG). Also on this date, I assisted Detective Elton with the execution of a search warrant at 2503 Baymont Place, Bremerton, Washington. Prior to the service of the search warrant, I attended a safety briefing. During that briefing, Detective Elton went over details of the case and provided assignments for the service of the search warrant. Detective Elton identified his primary suspect as Tarra Denton and indicated he had probable cause to arrest Denton for Delivery of a Controlled Substance, Percocet. Detective Elton also identified a female by the name of "Malaika" who he also had probable cause to arrest for Delivery of a Controlled Substance, Percocet. In addition to these two individuals, Detective Elton identified a subject by the name of Isaac Miller, who might also be residing at the residence. Apparently Isaac Miller is Tarra Denton's boyfriend.

The plan was to set up surveillance on 2503 Baymont Place and have an arrest / entry team waiting nearby until we knew for sure that Denton was at home. After the briefing, Detective Musselwhite cleared the office and responded to the area of the suspect's home. Detectives Elton, Whatley, Heffernan and I geared up and waited close-by until we got confirmation that Denton was home.

After a substantial period of time, Detective Musselwhite advised us that Denton had just arrived home in a silver, four-door, rental car. Detective Musselwhite was instructed to take Denton into custody. Denton was taken into custody at approximately 1658 hours. The entry team responded to the residence where I stood by with Denton, while the rest of the team made contact at the residence.

Once the residence was cleared, the people found inside had been detained and the residence was photographed, I assisted with a search of the residence. During my search, I located a purse on the floor, next to a couch. I searched this purse and located a used, marijuana smoking pipe (Item #SW10). I could not identify the owner of this purse, as there was no D&C evidence inside the purse that would help with that. I then located a used, glass, methamphetamine smoking pipe (Item #SW2) wrapped up in some cloth on the couch. Next to the couch, on a bottom shelf of a shelving unit, I located a large can of "Cheetos" (Item #SW13). I opened the top lid of this can and found that it was still sealed. Since this can of food was located in a place where there was no other food, I became suspicious that it contained a hidden compartment. I unscrewed the bottom of the can, which is normally where a hidden compartment would be on these types of containers, and the bottom actually unscrewed revealing a hidden container. This container was empty, but was taken as evidence. I unsealed the top port of the can and located Cheetos.

I located no other items of evidence. This concludes my involvement in this operation.

This report is being forwarded to summarize jail phone calls made to Isaac Miller from Tara Denton (AKA Lawson) between the dates of 9/30/11 and 10/6/11. These calls are recorded on the Telmate system. The caller and the person receiving the call are made aware that the calls are recorded and they are given the opportunity to continue on or disconnect the call.

In the following instances Denton contacts Miller on his cell phone (360) 286-3400. Denton used her PIN for calls 1, and 3 identifying herself properly. She is identified during other calls by voice even though she used the PIN assigned to Suzanna Braswell. This was the case during calls 2,4,5,and 6.

On 10/2/11 at 1403 a call coming from Denton's PIN to Miller's cell is recorded. Miller accepts the call and the terms that the call is recorded. In summary I heard Isaac asking Denton how "they" raided the "spot", which meant how did the police serve a warrant on Baymont Place. Denton responds to this question by saying that she did not know because none of the deliveries occurred from the Baymont address. She goes on say that she and Malaika were both accused of making deliveries to a "snitch" named "Jesse". Miller responds to this by saying "Wow, you were still fucking with him?". He said he told her the first time (referring to Jesse). Denton said 'I know weird huh?". He said "that ain't weird, I told you the first time". These statements were made on the recording between 1:03 and 1:39. Denton was told that the people upstairs at the Baymont address had gotten rid of all of her belongings, and she told Miller that she had over \$1000 in the pockets of her clothing there (@ 3:58 into conv.). She told Miller that we were acting as if she was a big time drug dealer, or a meth house cook (@8:00). At 8:35 into the conversation Miller is heard telling Denton "didn't I tell you that you had to fade to black?", telling her that he had warned her about getting caught prior to the arrest.. Denton responded to Miller by saying that she would stop smoking marijuana, selling marijuana, stealing from stores and that she would even stop talking to Miller (after this arrest). Denton said that she was "out there" for six months and before that she was a good church girl. Miller tells Denton that he told her not to "fuck with him (Jesse) from jump". Miller also told Denton that he had warned her to keep her shit (marijuana) in separate bags or in jars. Denton replied telling him that she had the names of what she bought on each bag, as if to imply that she was legal under the guise of medical marijuana use and possession.

On 10/2/11 at about 1449 hrs, a call coming from Denton's Telmate PIN to Miller's cell phone is recorded. Miller accepted the call and the terms that it would be recorded. In summary I heard Miller telling Denton that he picked up a grow light and grow tent up from the Baymont address after we left from serving the warrant. I heard Denton telling Miller that she did not believe that she would get off of the charges after he asked if she had prescriptions for all the pills she was arrested with. I heard Denton telling him that she was not going to do drugs anymore, and that she was not going to hustle anymore (street term for drug dealer), "that's not me". She tells Miller that she was dealing to impress him and that she was a female version of him. She referred to herself by saying something similar to I was a "boss" (street term for dealer with high status, or high ranking gang member). Isaac responds by telling her that she didn't have to do those things to impress him, and then he tells her that he is getting "it" legal (9:00) I can tell that he is referring to the purchase of marijuana because he goes on to say that he buys from dispensaries and changes dispensaries. Miller says "that's what you were doing when we first met". Denton and Miller discuss her methamphetamine use during this and other calls. Miller said he warned her about using meth.

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On10/3/11 at 1800 a call from Denton's PIN to Miller's cell is recorded. Miller accepts the call and the terms that the call is recorded. In summary I heard Denton telling Miller that she swallowed something at the jail to avoid being caught with it. He asked, "how many?" Denton responded by saying "it wasn't that". At 8:00 into the conversation Denton talks with Miller about him picking up her grow equipment. He tells Denton that he turned and left when he saw "everything going down" (the warrant service) at 9:45 into the conversation.

10/4/11 at 1236, Calls Miller from Suzanna Braswell's Telmate PIN. Explains that her PIN is not working for 48 hrs and she has gotten Braswell's PIN from her so that she can make calls. She said she and Braswell knew each other from the last time she was in jail.

On10/5/11 at 1147 Denton calls Miller from her Telmate PIN. This call is recorded. Miller accepts the call and the terms that the call is recorded. In summary I heard Denton asking Miller if he had money for her. At 00:49 Miller said he "can't make mother fuckers buy weed". He tells her that he had Denton's "QP". He tells her that he had two zips left out of that quarter pound and that he sold a zip for her yesterday. He said he had a zip and a half left for her. Denton told Miller that "Bryant" would buy it from him. Miller said he didn't have his number. He said "I don't know your clientele like that. Denton was frustrated and told Miller that she would give him all of her customers since she was going to be in prison. During an argument between the two, Miller asks Denton is she expects him to take a QP of weed to the bail bondsman in trade for \$1000 worth of their services, or does she want him to "get that weed off" in order to get her some "greenbacks that fold (street slang for cash)". Zips, and QPs are slang terms most commonly used when referring to marijuana sales. A zip is an ounce, and a QP is a quarter pound. Marijuana typically sells for \$10 per gram, but the value goes down when the weight goes up. At 12:44 Miller tells Denton he has been working on his deals, and her deals, and has no helper out here. Denton tells him that she has people who can help him and people who owe her a lot of money. Miller said that he understands that people owe her money, and he does not want to "fuck with" her people because he is suspicious of them due to her arrest.

10/6/11 at 1342 Denton calls Miller from her Telmate PIN. I heard Denton telling Miller that she would pay someone \$500 if they would co-sign for her bail. She said she needs someone with a good job. She tells Miller that a female in jail with her has a boyfriend in the Navy who would co-sign for her. At 4:26 she tells Miller that she is not messing around with illegal activities when she gets out. She says that she "knows" she is going to prison. She tells Miller that her attorney (Tom Weaver) thinks she will get DOSA and a small amount of prison time. She said she thinks she will get two years for the Hydrocodone delivery, but do 6 months in prison with DOSA.

This concludes call content summaries between Denton and Miller between 9/30/11 through 10/6/11.

On 29 Sept, 2011, I was performing my duties as a plain clothes detective with the Bremerton Police Department Special Operations Group. I assisted Det. Elton with the execution of a search warrant at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton WA.

Prior to service of the warrant, SOG conducted a briefing. During the briefing we discussed the target location, persons associated with the location and detective assignments at the location.

Before going directly to 2503 Baymont Place, SOG set a detective on surveillance of the location. We suspected the primary offender, Tarra Denton, was not at the location, as her vehicle was not present. The entry team stayed hidden away from the location and waited for her to arrive.

When Denton arrived, SOG moved in and arrested her as she exited her vehicle. The entry team then formed up to approach the target residence.

Everyone who was to be on scene was dressed in a manner clearly showing they were a police officer. Breaching tools were available and a detective was designated to force entry if needed. A team was designated to enter, clear the house and secure the occupants.

Duty weapons were out and ready. Based on my training and experience I know of the high risk involved in the service of narcotics related warrants. It is known that drug dealers often keep weapons to protect their investments (drugs and money). These weapons include clubs, knives and guns. They have also been known to use weapons to aid in their escapes, causing major officer safety issues. Safety is a primary concern for all involved.

My clothing and equipment for this search warrant consisted of a black utility vest with a badge and the word POLICE clearly marked on the front and back, black gloves and boots. I was armed with a handgun for back up and my assigned CAR 15 rifle as my primary entry weapon.

We approached the primary door used for the lower portion of the residence. At the door we knocked and announced our presence. The door was opened and I could see 3 female subjects in the living room. Maliaka Angevine, Sarah Gatchalian, and her mother, Rosalinda Frazer. The subjects were brought outside and detained.

We then entered the residence and secured it. No other people were found inside. I did note the odor of freshly burned marijuana in the residence.

I assisted in taking photos of the residence and collecting evidence. This included 23 white prescription pills (SW6) from a desk drawer in the living room, a plastic bag containing 92.6 grams of processed marijuana (SW4), which was also in the desk in the living room. Various items showing dominion and control for the residence and several items which appeared to be drug notes and ledgers.

I also found a perfume box (SW11) and a security box (SW11) from items used to purchase drugs in an early conducted controlled buy.

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I later assisted with placing the evidence in the BPD property room.

I did not assist in the interviews of any subjects involved.

On 30 Sept. 2011 I assisted Det Elton as he executed a search warrant on the car Denton had been driving at time of arrest. In the trunk of the car we found 11 bags of marijuana packaged in the manner commonly used for individual sale.

In the trunk we also found a stolen handgun.

In the trunk we also found meth smoking paraphernalia, and storage items containing meth residue.

I conducted multiple controlled purchases of Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet pills) with suspect Tarra D. Denton. These deals occurred within the city of Bremerton during the month of September 2011.

Each deal occurred in the same manner. I met with a police operative and another detective from SOG before each buy occurred. I searched the operative and the other detective searched the operative's car at this meeting. I provided the operative with the pre-recorded SOG funds used to purchase the drugs in this case. I was present at this meeting with the operative who would contact Tarra Denton each time to arrange the deal. I could hear their conversation via the operative's speaker phone. Denton is the main source of supply in this case. Denton would then arrange the pill deals with the operative and then either Tarra or Malaika Angevine would meet the operative in order to complete the purchase.

In each case the operative ended the call with Denton, and then the operative was followed to the deal location where they were observed meeting with Angevine or Tarra Denton. Denton used a van registered to her under the name Tarra Denton on a few of these occasions. I was on surveillance during four buys that were arranged with Denton. I visually observed Denton arriving and leaving from the deal locations during buy #1 and #4.

The operative was followed away from the controlled buys and met at a post-buy secure location. I met with the operative and at least one other detective, after the buys

occurred. The operative provided me with the purchased drugs while at this location. The operative and their vehicle were again searched at this location. The operative provided a description of what transpired during the buys with Denton or Malaika at this location as well. The operative said that Denton handed them the pills that were purchased with the SOG funds we provided during buy #1 and #4.

I put the purchased evidence into the BPD evidence room after each buy. I was able to confirm that the purchases drugs from buys #1 and 4 were schedule 2 drugs. This was determined by their appearance and the use of a pill identifier. They were specifically indentified as Oxycodone Hydrochloride.

I located and arrested Denton at about 1658 hrs today while serving a warrant on Baymont Place in Bremerton WA. She was arrested on the probable cause detailed above and advised of her rights. After a short interview she was transported to jail where she was booked for Delivery of a CS (prescription drugs – schedule 2) \$75,000 bail.

I was contacted by Ofc. Rauback who had transported Denton to the jail. He advised that Denton swallowed evidence when she had the opportunity during a more intimate search of her by female jail staff. I requested this search based on my investigation, and in the interest of keeping any drugs that were hiding in or on her person, out of the jail population. They were not able to recover the item she swallowed, she would not give details about what she swallowed. I provided what information I had learned through this investigation to Sgt. Craig Dick of the Kitsap County Jail so that they could monitor Denton's health in case she swallowed the type of drugs we were buying or that we located during the search of her and her residence (meth or marijuana).

On 9/21/11 at about 1525 hrs, I was on duty and assigned to SOG. I conducted a controlled purchase of one 15mg Percocet (Oxycodone Hydrochloride), a schedule 2 drug, from Tarra Denton. This buy was completed with the assistance of a police operative and two other SOG detectives; Det. Heffernan and Det. Whatley.

I met with Det. Heffernan and the operative prior to the buy. I searched the operative and Det. Heffernan searched the operative's car there. We located nothing of consequence during these searches. I was present with the operative at this location when Denton was contacted via cell phone. I heard their conversation and Denton agreeing to sell the operative one pill for \$30. Denton agreed to meet the operative at the same location as they met during buy #1, within the City of Bremerton.

I provided the operative with \$30 in pre-recorded SOG funds at this location which consisted of a \$20 and a \$10 bill. The serial numbers were copied into my notebook and then transferred to this report, and they were; (\$20) IL9238670D, (\$10) IF82618838A.

The operative was followed to the deal location. Det. Heffernan parked in the lot with the operative in view during surveillance. I was parked across the street where I was during buy #1. Det. Whatley was parked in the area anticipating the arrival and departure of Denton. He was tasked with following the suspect away from the deal to their next destination.

At about 1525 hrs, I observed the van Denton had arrived in during buy #1. This van came w/b on Kitsap Way and turned into the parking lot where the operative and Det. Heffernan were waiting. The van parked next to the operative and the operative entered the van (bearing WA# 532ZCH). The operative entered the van and was inside for one minute. The operative exited and re-entered their car. The operative left the deal location and was followed to the post-buy meeting where the operative would again meet with Det. Heffernan and I.

Det. Heffernan and I followed the operative away from the deal location and we met with the operative at the post-buy location where the operative and their vehicle were again searched. Nothing of consequence was located during these searches. The operative provided me with a baggie containing a pill. It was marked with 214 on one side and resembled the pills purchased during buy #1. I confirmed that these pills are Oxycodone Hydrochloride.

I asked the operative what happened during the meeting. The operative said that Denton was not in the van. The operative said that there was one female in the van and that this female was only known as "Malikai". I asked the operative if they had ever seen this person before. They operative said yes, but did not know an exact name of the female. The operative said that the female was provided with the SOG funds and then she handed the operative the baggie with the pill in it, which she retrieved from a pocket on her jacket or shirt. The operative said that they exited the van when the deal was done.

Det. Whatley reported to me that he followed the female in Denton's van to an address on Baymont Plc. This address was confirmed to be 2503 Baymont Plc. in Bremerton WA. This is the same address where the robbery of Denton occurred (11-008414).

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 These items are both secured in locked and alarmed facilities in the city of Bremerton, the County of Kitsap, State of Washington.

I am a duly appointed and qualified, acting commissioned police officer with the City of Bremerton Police Department assigned to the Special Operations Group. I have been employed by the City of Bremerton Police Department since July of 2000. I was assigned to the Special Operations Group from August of 2003 to March 2008. I was assigned to the Patrol Division in March 2008 and I worked there until May 16th, of 2011 when I was assigned to SOG again.

Preceding my employment with the City of Bremerton, I was employed with the Suquamish Police Department from May of 1999 to July of 2000. While working for Suquamish PD, I was assigned to patrol. I attended 440 hours training at the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Center in Burien completing this training in February of 2000. Included in this training I received instruction about drug identification, trafficking, and drug paraphernalia for my duties as a line police officer.

Prior to working at Suquamish I worked with the Subase Bangor Security Police Department from July 1996 through May of 1999. While employed there I attended 200 hours of initial training in Law Enforcement and Physical Security and logged numerous hours of other related training. I gained the title and position of Corporal/ Field Training Officer prior to moving on to Suquamish PD.

I was also a Reserve Deputy with the Kitsap County Sheriff's Office, in the State of Washington from January 1, 1997 to May of 1999. While working with the Sheriff's Office I was assigned to patrol. I attended a 220 basic law enforcement academy upon employment with the Sheriff's Office. I received instruction about drug identification, trafficking, and drug paraphernalia for my duties as a line Deputy.

During my law enforcement career, I have participated in multiple narcotics investigations, most of which resulted in arrests, and seizures of various controlled substances, which consisted of Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet), Powder, and Rock/ Crack Cocaine, Methamphetamine, Black Tar Heroin, methylenedioxy-methamphetamine (MDMA or Ecstasy) and Hallucinogens. In these investigations, I have become familiar with the methods of packaging controlled substances, values of controlled substances, terms associated with the manufacture, distribution,



and use of these controlled substances. I have been the affiant in approximately 100 search warrants, a majority being narcotics related

Based on my training and experience from 1997 to present, I know:

- 1. Persons manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances maintain books, records, receipts, notes, ledgers, airline tickets, money orders, and other papers related to the transportation, ordering, possession, sale and distribution of drugs. The aforementioned items may be carried by the suspect, or in the suspect's vehicle, or be kept in the suspect's house;
- 2. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances more often than not maintain addresses and/or telephone numbers in books or papers or in computers that reflect names, addresses and/or telephone numbers for drug customers and associated in their illegal drug organizations;
- 3. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances take or cause to be taken photographs and video recording of them, their associates, their property and their illegal product. These individuals usually maintain these photographs and recording in their possession or at their premises.
- 4. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances almost always keep paraphernalia for packaging, weighing and distribution of their illegal drugs. That paraphernalia includes, but is not limited to scales, packaging material, and chemicals to cut the drug product, razor blades, straws, and pipes.
- 5. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances commonly hide the drugs, their paraphernalia, the proceeds of their drug sales, and records of drug transactions in vehicles under their control, on their person, or in their residence, not only for easy access, but also to conceal them from law enforcement personnel;



- 6. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances almost always maintain amounts of money, financial instruments, jewelry and valuables, which are proceeds from or intended to be used to facilitate drug transactions. Further, that these individuals often place their assets under false names, or under other persons' names to avoid Detection. Even though these assets are in some other person's name, the drug trafficker continues to use the assets and exercises dominion and control over them. All such items, in addition to being evidence of drug trafficking violations, are forfeitable to the State pursuant to R.C.W. 69.50;
- 7. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances secrete contraband including drugs, the proceeds and records of drug transactions in secure locations within the premises under their dominion and control, in their vehicles, safe deposit boxes, self storage units and on their person not only for ready access but also to conceal them from law enforcement;
- 8. In addition to weapons, people manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances protect their illegal enterprises through the use of surveillance equipment, scanners, binoculars, and other miscellaneous equipment;
- 9. In order to conduct their illegal enterprise with the smallest amount of Detection from law enforcement officers, yet to allow their customers easy access to them, people manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances commonly use pagers, cellular telephones, telephones, answering machines, computer monitors, and other types of communication devices;
- 10. People manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances will often accept stolen property in exchange for controlled substances. They will also accept jewelry in lieu of cash for their product. From my training and experience this occurs quite often. Most people caught burglarizing homes



often take jewelry to trade for controlled substances. These items are not only sizeable as evidence of the trade, but are forfeitable under R.C.W. 69.50.505 as proceeds from their illegal operation;

- Dogs or other pets are situated on the property to warn suspects of intruders or law enforcement personnel;
- 12. Fictitious names on utility records and/or fictitious business names associated with the suspect's property and/or placing property and utility records in the names of others.

This affidavit is made in support of an application for search warrant for the property described as:

A silver Dodge Avenger 4 door, bearing Washington license plate number #ADY9372 and VIN: 1B3BD4FB6BN551585 and;

A black and gray colored Coach purse containing a bag of marijuana in plain view, and other items, which I believe belong to Tarra Denton.

These items are both secured in locked and alarmed facilities in the city of Bremerton, the County of Kitsap, State of Washington.

Probable cause for this search warrant is as follows:

Ono 9/29/2011 I was on duty and assigned to the Special Operations Group of the Bremerton Police Department. The Special Operations Group arrested Tarra D. Denton outside of her home at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton at about 1658 hrs. I had probable cause to arrest her based on a series of operations wherein she provided a police operative with prescription pills in exchange for money or other negotiable instruments during the month of September 2011.

Denton was arrested after she arrived in a silver Dodge Avenger with WA plate # ADY9372. She had exited and was removing something from the trunk when Det. Musselwhite approached her. He was wearing police equipment and marking that said "POLICE". She quickly shut the trunk when she saw him. Once she was arrested other detectives from SOG moved towards the lower portion of 2503 Baymont where it was determined that Denton was residing. Through the investigation into Denton and the probable cause I developed during that case I received a

warrant to search the residence on Baymont. The complaint was presented to Kitsap County Superior Court Judge M. K. Haberly on the morning of 9/29/2011. She authorized the warrant which was filed with the clerk's office under #20110346.

A second female was encountered in the house and she was also arrested. I had identified her as Malaika Angevine verbally. Malaika is an associate of Denton's. The arrest of Malaika was based on probable cause developed during the investigation of Denton and her drug dealing endeavors. Drug deals arranged between the operative and Denton were completed by Malaika on two of multiple occasions. I was present to hear the speaker phone conversation between the operative and Denton who arranged the terms of t he deals. Malaika drove Denton's van to meet the operative, deliver Denton's drugs, and collect the money (pre-recorded SOG funds) for Denton on two occasions.

I advised Malaika of her Miranda warnings, and I explained why she was arrested. She denied selling any drugs, admitted to smoking marijuana, and using one 5mg Vicodin pill on one occasion. I told her that I watched her meeting with the informant on more than one occasion and she changed her story slightly. She said that she has driven Denton to location where Denton sold drugs. Angevine was transported to the jail where she was booked for Delivery of a CS (schedule 2 prescription drugs - Percocet).

I interviewed Denton after advising her of her Miranda warnings. She admitted to abusing prescription pills, she admitted to using meth, and marijuana. She said she has a medical marijuana card in her purse, which was on the trunk of the car she was arrested at. She also told me and other officers there was marijuana in the purse. I noticed a baggie containing 3 pills in it on the ground at Denton's feet. These pills are similar to the ones purchased from Denton during this investigation.

Based on the investigation, and probable cause developed to arrest Denton and Malaika for delivery, and the fact that drug dealers carry items related to drug dealing on them or in their cars, I asked Ofc. Glasgow to apply his narcotics K9 to the exterior of the car she arrived in. I could



actually see what appeared to be leafy marijuana residue on the back seat and floor board of the car as I looked into it through the windows. I asked Ofc. Glasgow to search the exterior of the van that had been used in the drug deals as well (WA# 532 ZCH). The van was parked next to where Denton parked the Avenger. Ofc. Glasgow applied K9 Lance to the exterior of the Dodge Avenger (WA# ADY9372) and on the way to doing this Lance gave a positive alert to the purse that Denton had been in possession of at the time of her arrest. Ofc. Glasgow continued the application and advised that Lance also gave a positive alert at the trunk seem on the Avenger (Lance's K9 resume is attached). I could smell the odor of marijuana coming from this area of the trunk when I put my nose to the area as well. I am familiar with the smell of marijuana and this is based on my years as a police officers since 1997 and about 5 years as a narcotics detective.

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The operative in this case is working with the Bremerton Police Department in order to receive a favorable recommendation on pending theft charges. The operative also reported that their addiction to prescription drugs has landed them in the position they are in currently and expressed interest in assisting me and SOG with narcotics investigations they had the ability to complete with drug dealers in the Kitsap County area. The operative has further shown credibility through their own admissions against their interest. The operative has demonstrated a current and accurate knowledge of prescription pill, and Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet) prices, based on their own experiences. The operative was able to accurately describe to me the different drug packaging methods, methods of drug use, and the process of doing illicit drug deals, which are in line with my experiences as a narcotics detective and police officer since 1997. The operative has shown reliability through the completion of controlled substance purchases. I have completed 7 controlled purchases of prescription pills from three different dealers in the area with the assistance of this operative and detectives from the Bremerton police department. The operative in this case has no criminal history at this time. Detective's conducting pre and post-buy searches of the operative's car have located items in that car that had to be removed and placed into evidence. On one occasion at a post-buy search of the operative's car Sgt. Plumb located a small bag with half of a prescription pill inside of it with a piece of foil with signs of prescription pill use on it. It appeared to be an oversight since it was not located before the buy occurred, and they



are small items found in small places. The operative admitted to recognizing the items, and said they received the pill from someone days prior to our working relationship. The operative said that they forgot they were in the car. One a separate occasion, after this, Det. Heffernan located a bag with a small piece of marijuana leaf in it inside the car. The operative said they had cleaned the car out, and must not have seen this bag there. The operative is not the registered owner of the car and others in the family have access to it. It is possible that the item was left there by another. The packaging used in the deals completed by this operative was different from the packaging found in these two cases, leading me to believe that the operative was not stealing from me.

A criminal history of Denton shows a Felony conviction for Assault 2nd degree. A criminal history check of Angevine shows a 2010 Gross Misdemeanor conviction for Obstruction.

Therefore, I request authority to search for and seize the following items;

- 1. Any and all Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet); and marijuana.
- 2. Any books, records books, research products and materials, including formulas, tapes, film, photographs, data, calendars, receipts, notes, ledgers, computer disks or records, and other papers relating to the use, sale, ordering, transporting, purchase, possession and distribution of Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet);
- 3. Drug paraphernalia (all equipment, products, and materials of any kind which are used, intended for use, or designed for use in compounding, converting, producing, processing, weighing, packaging, containing, concealing, inhaling, ingesting or otherwise introducing into a human body: Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet)), including, but not limited to: paper bindles, plastic bags, "cutting" agents, scales and other weighing devices, heat sealing devices, pipes, hypodermic, tin foil and containers commonly associated with the storage, sale, and use of Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet); and any items described as drug paraphernalia under RCW 69.50.102;

NARCOTICS DETECTION K9 "Lance" WORK RESUME 01/01/2011

K9 "Lance" is an approximately 8 year old male, black and tan, Rottweiller who was rescued from the Seattle Animal Shelter. "Lance" and his former handler/trainer, Sgt Billy Renfro, received their training in Narcotics Detection-K9 Handler's course at McNeal Island Correctional Center at McNeal Island, Washington. This team successfully completed the 240 hour course in Canine Narcotics Detection. In addition, prior to this course, "Lance" received approximately one week of training in the previous K9 academy. Sgt Renfro and K9 Lance were trained by Master Trainer Sgt. Barbara Davenport who is employed with the Department of Corrections as a narcotics K9 team trainer.

On June 22, 2009 Officer Glasgow was assigned to the canine unit and began the Washington State Patrol Narcotics Detection Canine Class. Washington Administrative Code (W.A.C) 139-05-915 (3b) for the Narcotics Dog Handler (general detection) requires a minimum of 180 hours of specified training. This training consisted of approximately 217 hours of training in the classroom as well as the practical applications, which covered all specified areas by W.A.C. At the beginning of the class Officer Glasgow was assigned "Lance" a 6 year old Rotweiller.

"Lance" and his handler completed training as a "team", both handler and the canine are trained as a unit. 237 finds of laboratory tested narcotics substances and training aids have been completed by the team during the initial training. K9 "Lance" is trained to detect the presence of Marijuana/Hashish, Cocaine, Heroin, and Methamphetamine. "Lance" is trained to "alert" on controlled substances / odor by giving a "Passive" indication, which consist of him pin-pointing with his nose at an area as close to the source of the odor, then going to a "Sit" or "Down" position. This "alert" is demonstrated by a change of his behavior (rapid, closed mouth breathing, body animation, and ear set) that the handler has been trained to recognize. If "Lance" does not work to the source, his handler may then make presentations, which will assist "Lance" in locating the source of the odor.

The following topics were included in the Washington state Patrol Narcotics Canine Detection Course:

- Instincts Drives and Character Traits
- Modular Training Concept, Theory and Practice
- Conflict Training Concept, Theory and Practice
- Detection Canine Selection testing
- Detection Canine Handling Basics Detection Canine Training Progression
- Scent Production and Movement

- Search Patterns
- Proper Maintenance of Training Records
- Principals of Daily Grooming
- Canine First Aid

K9 "Lance" and his handler meet the minimum required standards as set forth in the Washington State Administrative Code (WAC: 139.05.915) for Narcotics Dog Teams / Handlers. This team's work is further enhanced by conducting maintenance training. Through October 1, 2010 K9 Lance has accumulated approximately 949.85 hours of Drug Detection Training. This team has accumulated approximately 319.85 hrs of Drug Detection Training.

As of this date K9 "Lance" has been used in approximately 642 applications which has resulted in numerous "alerts" with approximately 568 "locates" of controlled substances, paraphernalia, positive alert cash sniffs, or there are search warrants pending from alerts. This has led to the arrest of, or reinforced the Probable Cause for the arrests of approximately 326 suspects.

To date, K9 Lance has located illegal drugs at estimated street value of approximately \$254,980.50 and these efforts have led to the seizure / impounding of cash (not including other property seized) for civil seizure action, totaling approximately \$378,518.00



29 30 31 Bremerton Police Department assigned to the Special Operations Group. I have been employed by the City of Bremerton Police Department since July of 2000. I was assigned to the Special Operations Group from August of 2003 to March 2008. I was assigned to the Patrol Division in March 2008 and I worked there until May 16th, of 2011 when I was assigned to SOG again.

Preceding my employment with the City of Bremerton, I was employed with the Suquamish Police Department from May of 1999 to July of 2000. While working for Suquamish PD, I was assigned to patrol. I attended 440 hours training at the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Center in Burien completing this training in February of 2000. Included in this training I received instruction about drug identification, trafficking, and drug paraphernalia for my duties as a line police officer.

Prior to working at Suquamish I worked with the Subase Bangor Security Police Department from July 1996 through May of 1999. While employed there I attended 200 hours of initial training in Law Enforcement and Physical Security and logged numerous hours of other related training. I gained the title and position of Corporal/ Field Training Officer prior to moving on to Suquamish PD.

I was also a Reserve Deputy with the Kitsap County Sheriff's Office, in the State of Washington from January 1, 1997 to May of 1999. While working with the Sheriff's Office I was assigned to patrol. I attended a 220 basic law enforcement academy upon employment with the Sheriff's Office. I received instruction about drug identification, trafficking, and drug paraphernalia for my duties as a line Deputy.

During my law enforcement career, I have participated in multiple narcotics investigations, most of which resulted in arrests, and seizures of various controlled substances, which consisted of Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet), Powder, and Rock/ Crack Cocaine, Methamphetamine, Black Tar Heroin, methylenedioxy-methamphetamine (MDMA or Ecstasy) and Hallucinogens. In these investigations, I have become familiar with the methods of packaging controlled substances, values of controlled substances, terms associated with the manufacture, distribution, and use of these controlled substances. I have been the affiant in approximately 100 search warrants, a majority being narcotics related

Based on my training and experience from 1997 to present, I know:



- 1. Persons manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances maintain books, records, receipts, notes, ledgers, airline tickets, money orders, and other papers related to the transportation, ordering, possession, sale and distribution of drugs. The aforementioned items may be carried by the suspect, or in the suspect's vehicle, or be kept in the suspect's house;
- 2. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances more often than not maintain addresses and/or telephone numbers in books or papers or in computers that reflect names, addresses and/or telephone numbers for drug customers and associated in their illegal drug organizations;
- 3. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances take or cause to be taken photographs and video recording of them, their associates, their property and their illegal product. These individuals usually maintain these photographs and recording in their possession or at their premises.
- 4. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances almost always keep paraphernalia for packaging, weighing and distribution of their illegal drugs. That paraphernalia includes, but is not limited to scales, packaging material, and chemicals to cut the drug product, razor blades, straws, and pipes.
- 5. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances commonly hide the drugs, their paraphernalia, the proceeds of their drug sales, and records of drug transactions in vehicles under their control, on their person, or in their residence, not only for easy access, but also to conceal them from law enforcement personnel;
- 6. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances almost always maintain amounts of money, financial instruments, jewelry and valuables, which are proceeds from or intended to be used to facilitate drug transactions. Further, that these individuals often place their assets under false



names, or under other persons' names to avoid Detection. Even though these assets are in some other person's name, the drug trafficker continues to use the assets and exercises dominion and control over them. All such items, in addition to being evidence of drug trafficking violations, are forfeitable to the State pursuant to R.C.W. 69.50;

- 7. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances secrete contraband including drugs, the proceeds and records of drug transactions in secure locations within the premises under their dominion and control, in their vehicles, safe deposit boxes, self storage units and on their person not only for ready access but also to conceal them from law enforcement;
- 8. In addition to weapons, people manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances protect their illegal enterprises through the use of surveillance equipment, scanners, binoculars, and other miscellaneous equipment;
- 9. In order to conduct their illegal enterprise with the smallest amount of Detection from law enforcement officers, yet to allow their customers easy access to them, people manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances commonly use pagers, cellular telephones, telephones, answering machines, computer monitors, and other types of communication devices;
- 10. People manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances will often accept stolen property in exchange for controlled substances. They will also accept jewelry in lieu of cash for their product. From my training and experience this occurs quite often. Most people caught burglarizing homes often take jewelry to trade for controlled substances. These items are not only sizeable as evidence of the trade, but are forfeitable under R.C.W. 69.50.505 as proceeds from their illegal operation;
- 11. Dogs or other pets are situated on the property to warn suspects of intruders or



law enforcement personnel;

12. Fictitious names on utility records and/or fictitious business names associated with the suspect's property and/or placing property and utility records in the names of others.

This affidavit is made in support of an application for search warrant for the property described as:

A stick built residence, cream colored with dark colored trim and the numbers "2503" affixed to the front of the structure, which has an attached carport on the south side. This residence is located in the city of Bremerton, the County of Kitsap, State of Washington.

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Probable cause for this search warrant is as follows:

During the month of September 2011 I conducted multiple controlled purchases of Oxycodone Hydrochloride pills from a suspect identified as Tarra D. Denton 11/19/1977 (AKA: Tarra Lawson). These buys were completed with the assistance of a police operative and detectives with the Special Operations Group. All the buys were completed within the City of Bremerton, and/or the County of Kitsap, in the State of Washington.

The operative in this case is working with the Bremerton Police Department in order to receive a favorable recommendation on pending theft charges. The operative also reported that their addiction to prescription drugs has landed them in the position they are in currently and expressed interest in assisting me and SOG with narcotics investigations they had the ability to complete with drug dealers in the Kitsap County area. The operative has further shown credibility through their own admissions against their interest. The operative has demonstrated a current and accurate knowledge of prescription pill, and Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet) prices, based on their own experiences. The operative was able to accurately describe to me the different drug packaging methods, methods of drug use, and the process of doing illicit drug deals, which are in line with my experiences as a narcotics detective and police officer since 1997. The operative has shown reliability through the completion of controlled substance purchases. I have completed 7

controlled purchases of prescription pills from three different dealers in the area with the assistance of this operative and detectives from the Bremerton police department. The operative in this case has no criminal history at this time.

The operative has contacted Denton prior to each buy to arrange the deals SOG has investigated during the month of September 2011. Denton has sent a female only known as Malika, to meet with the operative on multiple occasions. Malika has sold pills to the operative for Denton during those instances. Malika has driven a van belonging to Denton to these deals. Malika was followed back to Baymont Place after she was observed selling Percocet pills to the operative on 9/22/2011. Det. Whatley conducted the surveillance of Malika and the van back to Baymont Place on that date. The operative and their vehicle was searched before and after each of the buys.

The operative was provided with pre-recorded SOG funds or photographed property, which were given to Denton or her associate, Malika, in exchange for prescription pills. The prescription pills that the operative purchased during deals arranged with Denton were all placed into the BPD property room as evidence. They were all confirmed to be schedule 2 drugs. The searches were conducted by me and another detective assigned to SOG.

Sgt. Plumb did located a baggie with a partial Percocet pill in it and some foil with signs of prescription pill use on it during a search of the operative's car, after one of the buys with Denton. This item was not located during the pre-buy search. The operative said they were not aware that the item was still in there and admitted that they recognized it as a pill they had been provided prior to our working relationship that they had forgotten about. The baggie was marked with a unique print. This print was never used by Denton to package pills sold to the operative before that buy, during that buy, or after that buy. It appeared to be a simple oversight by Sgt. Plumb and forgotten about by the operative.

Det. Heffernan located a baggie with black and gold print on it in the operative's car during a prebuy search prior to a controlled buy being completed. This baggie was located under the driver's

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seat and held a very small piece of what appeared to be a marijuana leaf. When the operative was shown the baggie the operative said that they had no idea it was in the car. The operative said that they tried to clean the car out after the incident described above and concluded that it might have been overlooked. The operative also advised that they share a car with a close family member, which is another plausible excuse.

In the process of identifying Tarra Denton and determining where she lived, Sgt. Plumb located a recent police report in I Leads tying her to an address at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton WA. It should be noted that the operative knew that Denton lives near N. Cambrian, which is near Baymont Place. The operative said that Denton lives with her boyfriend, a black male.

In the report located by Sgt. Plumb (BPD case #11-008414), which was taken on August 31st, 2011, Tarra Denton was the victim of what appears to be a home invasion robbery. The robbery occurred at 2503 Baymont Place, Bremerton, Washington. During the robbery the suspects stole 360 Vicoden pills and approximately \$2,500.00 in cash, along with her grey "Coach" purse that contained a white I-phone, a Bank of America debit card, a Washington State driver's license, and approximately \$300.00 cash. It was noted that during the 11-008414 interview of Denton, she indicated she was living there with an individual by the name of Isaac Miller. Isaac Miller was fully identified as Isaac Shandon Miller, DOB: 11/15/1982 and happens to be a black male.

On 9/27/11 I was on duty and assigned to the Special Operations Group of the Bremerton Police Department I was with the police operative in this case when they contacted Tarra Denton via cell phone. I listened to the conversation between them and heard Tarra asking the operative to steal certain specific items from stores. Tarra has a history of giving "boosters", people who steal property for her, prescription drugs in return. It is my understanding that there is a pending case against Tarra for this type of criminal activity at this time.

During the time I was with the operative they had a conversation with Tarra. Tarra said that she had a list of items that she wanted from Fred Meyers. Tarra asked the operative to steal size 5 jeans, perfume, a hair straightener that costs \$59.99 and an Xbox controller from Fred Meyers.

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She then said that she already had a new controller. There was no discussion regarding the specific amount of pills she would give the operative in return for "stolen items." The operative ended the call with Tarra Denton and advised me that the amount of prescription pills that Denton would trade for stolen goods was dependent on the merchandise she was presented with and her mood.

I have listened to many calls that the operative has made to Denton since the beginning of this investigation and I can confirm that she is moody, rude and during some calls she has been manipulative. For instance, when the operative called to arrange to buy Oxycodone Hydrochloride from her on one occasion she told the operative she wanted them to "boost" for her and that she would not sell the operative pills for money. She demanded stolen merchandise instead. When the operative refused Denton increased the price of the pills and agreed to sell them at an inflated price.

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On 9/27/11, Depurchased Juicy Couture perfume and hair straightener from Fred Meyer on 9/27/11. I searched the hair straightener aisle and found the one product that was priced at \$59.99 as Denton requested. I photographed these items in detail and copied the codes and numbers from their labels onto my notebook (see attached copies of photos and notes). I met with the operative again as planned after the earlier call to Denton.

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I met with the operative and Det. Heffernan at a secure location where the operative again contacted Denton. Prior to meeting with the operative I asked Det. Whatley to conduct surveillance of Denton's house at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton WA. Det. Whatley was prior to and during the time this call to Denton was made. I anticipated Denton agreeing to meet with the operative to do a pill deal. When the operative contacted Denton and advised her that they had some of the "stolen items" she described earlier I heard Denton telling the operative that she could not talk right now because she thought she was "about to be raided." Tarra abruptly hung up the phone at this time.

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I contacted Det. Whatley to tell him to leave the area suspecting someone had seen him on

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surveillance. Det. Whatley advised me that he saw several cars come and go from the area of Baymont, which is a dead end. He also told me that he saw two cars come and go from there more than once, and that the occupants looked at him each time. We concluded that this was in fact why she was concerned about being raided.

I canceled the operation and asked the operative to call me if Denton called back. At about 1647 hrs, I was still on duty and I received a call from the operative. The operative advised me that Tarra Denton had called back and that she was ready to do the deal.

I advised Sgt. Plumb, Det. Whatley, Det. Heffernan and Det. Musselwhite (all of SOG) and they were assigned different responsibilities for the impending operation with Denton and the operative.

I met with Det. Heffernan and the operative at the pre-buy location. I showed the operative a photo lineup consisting of 6 female photographs. I advised the operative to look at the line up and to point to any photo that they recognized. I advised that it was ok not to identify anyone and that there was a chance that they would not recognize anyone in the photos. I asked the operative to only identify someone if they were 100% certain of their identity. The operative identified one of the photos on the page. The operative said that it was Tarra Denton and was correct in doing so. The operative circled the photo of Denton, initialed and dated it.

At the pre-buy location I searched the operative and Det. Heffernan searched the operative's car prior to the buy. Nothing of consequence was located during those searches. I was with the operative when they tried to contact Denton on her cell to arrange the meeting. She did not answer. The operative contacted a female associated of Denton's, Malika (unknown spelling). Malika was contacted via cell and she said she was with Denton. The operative advised Malika that they could not reach Denton on her cell. Malika told the operative that Denton would meet them at the Taco Bell on Kitsap Way in Bremerton WA to do the deal.

I provided the operative with the photographed perfume and straightener from Fred Meyer. The



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operative was then followed to the Taco Bell parking lot arriving at about 1725 hrs. Det. Whatley and Sgt. Plumb were already there on surveillance. The operative contacted me shortly after their arrival at Taco Bell to tell me that Denton called and changed the location to the McDonald's on Kitsap Way. This is a common tactic used by dealers who are concerned about being arrested as a result of an informant working with the police. The surveillance units were advised of the change in locations and they repositioned themselves with a view of the McDonald's lot, which is just west of the Taco Bell location.

The operative was advised when they were allowed to move from Taco Bell to the McDonald's. I observed the operative entering the McDonald's lot and parking in view of Kitsap Way as instructed at about 1730 hrs.

I received a call from Det. Musselwhite who was on surveillance on Baymont Place. He advised that three cars just left the area of Denton's house on Baymont. They were a silver Honda, dark colored Jeep Cherokee and a white Mercury Cougar. I advised surveillance units of these vehicle descriptions in case they were being used as counter-surveillance. Shortly after that I observed a dark colored Jeep Cherokee coming from Corbet Dr and turning w/b onto Kitsap Way. I advised units of this and they advised that they could see it as well. I moved to a vantage point where I could see the operative's car in the McDonald's lot. During this time the Jeep pulled into the lot and turned around. I saw the Jeep parking in the lot facing the McDonald's play area. I then observed the operative entering the rear passenger door of the Jeep. They were seated behind the driver. This occurred at about 1741 hrs. The operative was inside the Jeep for a few minutes until emerging at about 1752 hrs and returning to their car.

The Jeep left the lot and turned westbound onto Kitsap Way. An attempt was made to follow the car, but surveillance units lost it. Det. Musselwhite was still on surveillance on Baymont and advised that the meeting occurred and the Jeep had left the lot. I asked him to report back to me when and if the Jeep returned to Baymont.

I contacted the operative by phone and asked if the deal occurred. The operative said that Denton



was the passenger in the Jeep and that it was driven by an unknown white female. The operative said that Denton gave them two 15mg Percocet pills in exchange for the Juicy Couture and hair straightener. I advised the operative that we were following him to the post-buy location.

At about 1809 Det. Musselwhite contacted me by phone from Baymont Place and he advised that the same Jeep Cherokee just arrived back to the Baymont address. He advised he saw two females exiting the Jeep and entering the house on Baymont. He provided the plate on the Jeep. It was Washington plate #556UTW, registered to Jeannee Brown in Bremerton WA.

I met the operative at the post-buy location with Det. Heffernan and Det, Whatley. The operative handed me two round, blue, small pills marked with 214. These have been confirmed to be Oxycodone Hydrochloride (15mg pills). These are schedule 2 drugs. I searched the operative at this location and Det. Whatley searched the operative's car. Nothing of consequence was located during these searches.

I conducted a recorded interview with the operative at this location. I had the operative's permission to record their voice during the interview. In short, the operative described their relationship with Denton, their knowledge that Denton sells prescription pills, and trades stolen property for pills. The operative explained that they had done these types of deals with Denton prior to their relationship with the police. The operative said that they had done over 30 illicit pill deals with Denton as a rough estimate.

In regards to the deal at McDonald's, the operative advised that Denton was the passenger in the Jeep. They operative did not know the female driver. The operative said that Denton was given the perfume and straightener and that Denton tried to give them one 15mg Percocet in return. She reportedly retrieved this pill from the area of her breasts inside of her shirt. The operative objected to this knowing the value of a 15mg pill is about \$20. The operative said that Denton offered to give them some "weed" (Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet)) in addition to the one 15mg pill. The operative objected to this and Denton retrieved another 15mg Percocet from the area of her breasts inside her shirt.



The operative said that Denton made small talk with them and asked them if they would go steal items from Target. The operative refused. The operative exited the Jeep and returned to their car with the 2 Percocet pills given to them by Denton. The operative then drove to the post-buy search location where we met.

The two Percocet pills were placed into the Bremerton Police property room after the buy.

It is my belief that this investigation has shown a repeated pattern of illicit drug dealing by Tarra Denton. Denton has been shown to reside at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton WA, through surveillance techniques, and the completion of controlled buys with Denton. The additional evidence that she is involved in drug possession and likely drug dealing from that address is seen in the August 2011 Bremerton Police report where Denton reports a home invasion robbery at her Baymont address, and drugs, and cash were stolen from her during that robbery. It is my belief and the investigation shows that Denton and her associates are still conducting their illegal drug sales crimes out of the Baymont address as demonstrated by the controlled buy operation conducted on 9/27/11 (described above). I believe that evidence of the crime of delivery of a controlled substance, to wit; Oxycodone Hydrochloride is located inside of 2503 Baymont Place, in Bremerton WA.

A criminal history check of Denton shows that she has been convicted of one felony for Assault 2nd degree in 2001. She has been arrested for theft, controlled substance possession (prescription drugs), possession of drug paraphernalia, theft (organized retail), possession of stolen property, assault 1st degree, assault 4th degree, and false reporting.

Therefore, I request authority to search for and seize the following items;

- 1. Any and all Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet); and

I am a duly appointed and qualified, acting commissioned police officer with the City of

Bremerton Police Department assigned to the Special Operations Group. I have been employed by the City of Bremerton Police Department since July of 2000. I was assigned to the Special Operations Group from August of 2003 to March 2008. I was assigned to the Patrol Division in March 2008 and I worked there until May 16th, of 2011 when I was assigned to SOG again.

Preceding my employment with the City of Bremerton, I was employed with the Suquamish Police Department from May of 1999 to July of 2000. While working for Suquamish PD, I was assigned to patrol. I attended 440 hours training at the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Center in Burien completing this training in February of 2000. Included in this training I received instruction about drug identification, trafficking, and drug paraphernalia for my duties as a line police officer.

Prior to working at Suquamish I worked with the Subase Bangor Security Police Department from July 1996 through May of 1999. While employed there I attended 200 hours of initial training in Law Enforcement and Physical Security and logged numerous hours of other related training. I gained the title and position of Corporal/ Field Training Officer prior to moving on to Suquamish PD.

I was also a Reserve Deputy with the Kitsap County Sheriff's Office, in the State of Washington from January 1, 1997 to May of 1999. While working with the Sheriff's Office I was assigned to patrol. I attended a 220 basic law enforcement academy upon employment with the Sheriff's Office. I received instruction about drug identification, trafficking, and drug paraphernalia for my duties as a line Deputy.

During my law enforcement career, I have participated in multiple narcotics investigations, most of which resulted in arrests, and seizures of various controlled substances, which consisted of Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet), Powder, and Rock/ Crack Cocaine, Methamphetamine, Black Tar Heroin, methylenedioxy-methamphetamine (MDMA or Ecstasy) and Hallucinogens. In these investigations, I have become familiar with the methods of packaging controlled substances, values of controlled substances, terms associated with the manufacture, distribution, and use of these controlled substances. I have been the affiant in approximately 100 search warrants, a majority being narcotics related

Based on my training and experience from 1997 to present, I know:

THE AP COUNTY

- 1. Persons manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances maintain books, records, receipts, notes, ledgers, airline tickets, money orders, and other papers related to the transportation, ordering, possession, sale and distribution of drugs. The aforementioned items may be carried by the suspect, or in the suspect's vehicle, or be kept in the suspect's house;
- 2. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances more often than not maintain addresses and/or telephone numbers in books or papers or in computers that reflect names, addresses and/or telephone numbers for drug customers and associated in their illegal drug organizations;
- 3. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances take or cause to be taken photographs and video recording of them, their associates, their property and their illegal product. These individuals usually maintain these photographs and recording in their possession or at their premises.
- 4. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances almost always keep paraphernalia for packaging, weighing and distribution of their illegal drugs. That paraphernalia includes, but is not limited to scales, packaging material, and chemicals to cut the drug product, razor blades, straws, and pipes.
- 5. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances commonly hide the drugs, their paraphernalia, the proceeds of their drug sales, and records of drug transactions in vehicles under their control, on their person, or in their residence, not only for easy access, but also to conceal them from law enforcement personnel;
- 6. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances almost always maintain amounts of money, financial instruments, jewelry and valuables, which are proceeds from or intended to be used to facilitate drug transactions. Further, that these individuals often place their assets under false



names, or under other persons' names to avoid Detection. Even though these assets are in some other person's name, the drug trafficker continues to use the assets and exercises dominion and control over them. All such items, in addition to being evidence of drug trafficking violations, are forfeitable to the State pursuant to R.C.W. 69.50;

- 7. Individuals manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances secrete contraband including drugs, the proceeds and records of drug transactions in secure locations within the premises under their dominion and control, in their vehicles, safe deposit boxes, self storage units and on their person not only for ready access but also to conceal them from law enforcement;
- 8. In addition to weapons, people manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances protect their illegal enterprises through the use of surveillance equipment, scanners, binoculars, and other miscellaneous equipment;
- 9. In order to conduct their illegal enterprise with the smallest amount of Detection from law enforcement officers, yet to allow their customers easy access to them, people manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances commonly use pagers, cellular telephones, telephones, answering machines, computer monitors, and other types of communication devices;
- 10. People manufacturing, possessing and distributing controlled substances will often accept stolen property in exchange for controlled substances. They will also accept jewelry in lieu of cash for their product. From my training and experience this occurs quite often. Most people caught burglarizing homes often take jewelry to trade for controlled substances. These items are not only sizeable as evidence of the trade, but are forfeitable under R.C.W. 69.50.505 as proceeds from their illegal operation;
- 11. Dogs or other pets are situated on the property to warn suspects of intruders or



law enforcement personnel;

12. Fictitious names on utility records and/or fictitious business names associated with the suspect's property and/or placing property and utility records in the names of others.

This affidavit is made in support of an application for search warrant for the property described as:

The lower portion of a stick built residence on Baymont Place. It is cream colored with dark colored trim, and the numbers "2503" affixed to the front of the structure and left of the door, This residence has an attached carport on the south side. Access to the basement in on the back side of the house. This residence is located in the city of Bremerton, the County of Kitsap, State of Washington.

Probable cause for this search warrant is as follows:

During the month of September 2011 I conducted multiple controlled purchases of Oxycodone Hydrochloride pills from a suspect identified as Tarra D. Denton 11/19/1977 (AKA: Tarra Lawson). These buys were completed with the assistance of a police operative and detectives with the Special Operations Group. All the buys were completed within the City of Bremerton, and County of Kitsap, in the State of Washington.

The operative in this case is working with the Bremerton Police Department in order to receive a favorable recommendation on pending theft charges. The operative also reported that their addiction to prescription drugs has landed them in the position they are in currently and expressed interest in assisting me and SOG with narcotics investigations they had the ability to complete with drug dealers in the Kitsap County area. The operative has further shown credibility through their own admissions against their interest. The operative has demonstrated a current and accurate knowledge of prescription pill, and Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet) prices, based on their own experiences. The operative was able to accurately describe to me the different drug packaging methods, methods of drug use, and the process of doing illicit drug deals, which are in line with my experiences as a narcotics detective and police officer since 1997. The operative has shown reliability through the completion of controlled substance purchases. I have completed 7 controlled purchases of prescription pills from three different dealers in the area with the



assistance of this operative and detectives from the Bremerton police department. The operative in this case has no criminal history at this time.

The operative has contacted Denton in order to arrange the deals SOG has investigated during the month of September 2011. Denton has sent a female only known as Malika, to meet with the operative on multiple occasions. Malika has sold pills to the operative for Denton during those instances. Malika has driven a van belonging to Denton to these deals. Malika was followed back to Baymont Place after she was observed selling Percocet pills to the operative on 9/22/2011. Det. Whatley conducted the surveillance of Malika and the van back to Baymont Place on that date. The prescription pills that the operative purchased during deals arranged with Denton were all placed into the BPD property room as evidence. They were all confirmed to be schedule 2 drugs.

The operative was searched prior to and after each of the controlled buy operations occurring. The searches were conducted by me and another detective assigned to SOG. Sgt. Plumb located a baggie with a partial Percocet pill in it and some foil with signs of prescription pill use on it during a search of the operative's car, after one of the buys with Denton. This item was not located during the pre-buy search. The operative said they were not aware that the item was still in there and admitted that they recognized it as a pill they had been provided prior to our working relationship that they had forgotten about. The baggie was marked with a unique print. This print was never used by Denton to package pills sold to the operative before that buy, during that buy, or after that buy. It appeared to be a simple oversight by Sgt. Plumb and forgotten about by the operative.

Det. Heffernan located a baggie with black and gold print on it in the operative's car during a prebuy search prior to a controlled buy being completed. This baggie was located under the driver's seat and held a very small piece of what appeared to be a Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet) leaf. When the operative was shown the baggie the operative said that they had no idea it was in the car. The operative said that they tried to clean the car out after the incident described above and concluded that it might have been overlooked. The operative also advised that they share a



car with a close family member, which is another plausible excuse.

In the process of identifying Tarra Denton and determining where she lived, Sgt. Plumb located a recent police report in I Leads tying her to an address at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton WA. It should be noted that the operative knew that Denton lives near N. Cambrian, which is near Baymont Place. The operative said that Denton lives with her boyfriend, a black male.

In the report located by Sgt. Plumb (BPD case #11-008414), which was taken on August 31st, 2011, Tarra Denton was the victim of what appears to be a home invasion robbery. The robbery occurred at 2503 Baymont Place, Bremerton, Washington. During the robbery the suspects stole 360 Vicoden pills and approximately \$2,500.00 in cash, along with her grey "Coach" purse that contained a white I-phone, a Bank of America debit card, a Washington State driver's license, and approximately \$300.00 cash. It was noted that during the 11-008414 interview of Denton, she indicated she was living there with an individual by the name of Isaac Miller. Isaac Miller was fully identified as Isaac Shandon Miller, DOB: 11/15/1982 and happens to be a black male.

On 9/27/11 I was on duty and assigned to the Special Operations Group of the Bremerton Police Department I was with the police operative in this case when they contacted Tarra Denton via cell phone. I listened to the conversation between them and heard Tarra asking the operative to steal certain specific items from stores. Tarra has a history of giving "boosters", people who steal property for her, prescription drugs in return. It is my understanding that there is a pending case against Tarra for this type of criminal activity at this time.

During the time I was with the operative they had a conversation with Tarra. Tarra said that she had a list of items that she wanted from Fred Meyers. Tarra asked the operative to steal size 5 jeans, perfume, a hair straightener that costs \$59.99 and an Xbox controller from Fred Meyers. She then said that she already had a new controller. There was no discussion regarding the specific amount of pills she would give the operative in return for "stolen items." The operative ended the call with Tarra Denton and advised me that the amount of prescription pills that Denton would trade for stolen goods was dependent on the merchandise she was presented with and her



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I met with the operative and Det. Heffernan at a secure location where the operative again contacted Denton. Prior to meeting with the operative I asked Det. Whatley to conduct surveillance of Denton's house at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton WA. Det. Whatley was prior to and during the time this call to Denton was made. I anticipated Denton agreeing to meet with the operative to do a pill deal. When the operative contacted Denton and advised her that they had some of the "stolen items" she described earlier I heard Denton telling the operative that she could not talk right now because she thought she was "about to be raided." Tarra abruptly hung up the phone at this time.

I contacted Det. Whatley to tell him to leave the area suspecting someone had seen him on surveillance. Det. Whatley advised me that he saw several cars come and go from the area of Baymont, which is a dead end. He also told me that he saw two cars come and go from there more than once, and that the occupants looked at him each time. We concluded that this was in fact why she was concerned about being raided.



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I advised Sgt. Plumb, Det. Whatley, Det. Heffernan and Det. Musselwhite (all of SOG) and they were assigned different responsibilities for the impending operation with Denton and the operative.

I met with Det. Heffernan and the operative at the pre-buy location. I showed the operative a photo lineup consisting of 6 female photographs. I advised the operative to look at the line up and to point to any photo that they recognized. I advised that it was ok not to identify anyone and that there was a chance that they would not recognize anyone in the photos. I asked the operative to only identify someone if they were 100% certain of their identity. The operative identified one of the photos on the page. The operative said that it was Tarra Denton and was correct in doing so. The operative circled the photo of Denton, initialed and dated it.

At the pre-buy location I searched the operative and Det. Heffernan searched the operative's car prior to the buy. Nothing of consequence was located during those searches. I was with the operative when they tried to contact Denton on her cell to arrange the meeting. She did not answer. The operative contacted a female associated of Denton's, Malika (unknown spelling). Malika was contacted via cell and she said she was with Denton. The operative advised Malika that they could not reach Denton on her cell. Malika told the operative that Denton would meet them at the Taco Bell on Kitsap Way in Bremerton WA to do the deal.

I provided the operative with the photographed perfume and straightener from Fred Meyer. The operative was then followed to the Taco Bell parking lot arriving at about 1725 hrs. Det. Whatley and Sgt. Plumb were already there on surveillance. The operative contacted me shortly after their arrival at Taco Bell to tell me that Denton called and changed the location to the McDonald's on Kitsap Way. This is a common tactic used by dealers who are concerned about being arrested as



a result of an informant working with the police. The surveillance units were advised of the change in locations and they repositioned themselves with a view of the McDonald's lot, which is just west of the Taco Bell location.

The operative was advised when they were allowed to move from Taco Bell to the McDonald's. I observed the operative entering the McDonald's lot and parking in view of Kitsap Way as instructed at about 1730 hrs.

I received a call from Det. Musselwhite who was on surveillance on Baymont Place. He advised that three cars just left the area of Denton's house on Baymont. They were a silver Honda, dark colored Jeep Cherokee and a white Mercury Cougar. I advised surveillance units of these vehicle descriptions in case they were being used as counter-surveillance. Shortly after that I observed a dark colored Jeep Cherokee coming from Corbet Dr and turning w/b onto Kitsap Way. I advised units of this and they advised that they could see it as well. I moved to a vantage point where I could see the operative's car in the McDonald's lot. During this time the Jeep pulled into the lot and turned around. I saw the Jeep parking in the lot facing the McDonald's play area. I then observed the operative entering the rear passenger door of the Jeep. They were seated behind the driver. This occurred at about 1741 hrs. The operative was inside the Jeep for a few minutes until emerging at about 1752 hrs and returning to their car.

The Jeep left the lot and turned westbound onto Kitsap Way. An attempt was made to follow the car, but surveillance units lost it. Det. Musselwhite was still on surveillance on Baymont and advised that the meeting occurred and the Jeep had left the lot. I asked him to report back to me when and if the Jeep returned to Baymont.

I contacted the operative by phone and asked if the deal occurred. The operative said that Denton was the passenger in the Jeep and that it was driven by an unknown white female. The operative said that Denton gave them two 15mg Percocet pills in exchange for the Juicy Couture and hair straightener. I advised the operative that we were following him to the post-buy location.



At about 1809 Det. Musselwhite contacted me by phone from Baymont Place and he advised that the same Jeep Cherokee just arrived back to the Baymont address. He advised he saw two females exiting the Jeep and entering the house on Baymont. He provided the plate on the Jeep. It was Washington plate #556UTW, registered to Jeannee Brown in Bremerton WA.

I met the operative at the post-buy location with Det. Heffernan and Det, Whatley. The operative handed me two round, blue, small pills marked with 214. These have been confirmed to be Oxycodone Hydrochloride (15mg pills). These are schedule 2 drugs. I searched the operative at this location and Det. Whatley searched the operative's car. Nothing of consequence was located during these searches.

I conducted a recorded interview with the operative at this location. I had the operative's permission to record their voice during the interview. In short, the operative described their relationship with Denton, their knowledge that Denton sells prescription pills, and trades stolen property for pills. The operative explained that they had done these types of deals with Denton prior to their relationship with the police. The operative said that they had done over 30 illicit pill deals with Denton as a rough estimate.

In regards to the deal at McDonald's, the operative advised that Denton was the passenger in the Jeep. They operative did not know the female driver. The operative said that Denton was given the perfume and straightener and that Denton tried to give them one 15mg Percocet in return. She reportedly retrieved this pill from the area of her breasts inside of her shirt. The operative objected to this knowing the value of a 15mg pill is about \$20. The operative said that Denton offered to give them some "weed" (Oxycodone Hydrochloride (Percocet)) in addition to the one 15mg pill. The operative objected to this and Denton retrieved another 15mg Percocet from the area of her breasts inside her shirt.

The operative said that Denton made small talk with them and asked them if they would go steal items from Target. The operative refused. The operative exited the Jeep and returned to their car with the 2 Percocet pills given to them by Denton. The operative then drove to the post-buy



 search location where we met.

The two Percocet pills were placed into the Bremerton Police property room after the buy.

It is my belief that this investigation has shown a repeated pattern of illicit drug dealing by Tarra Denton. Denton has been shown to reside at 2503 Baymont Place in Bremerton WA, through surveillance techniques, and the completion of controlled buys with Denton. The additional evidence that she is involved in drug possession and likely drug dealing is seen in the August 2011 Bremerton Police report where Denton reports a home invasion robbery at her Baymont address, and drugs, and cash were stolen from her during that robbery. It is my belief and the investigation shows that Denton and her associates are still conducting their illegal drug sales crimes out of the Baymont address as demonstrated by the controlled buy operation conducted on 9/27/11 (described above). I believe that evidence of the crime of delivery of a controlled substance, to wit; Oxycodone Hydrochloride is located inside of 2503 Baymont Place, in Bremerton WA.

A criminal history check of Denton shows that she has been convicted of one felony for Assault 2nd degree in 2001. She has been arrested for theft, controlled substance possession (prescription drugs), possession of drug paraphernalia, theft (organized retail), possession of stolen property, assault 1st degree, assault 4th degree, and false reporting.

On 9/27/2011 while discussing the service of a warrant at 2503 Baymont Plc with other SOG detectives, I was advised that there was indication in the robbery investigation that Denton lived in the basement portion of 2503 Baymont Plc. I contacted the owner of the residence who advised me that her daughter, Sarah Mercer, lives in the upstairs portion and that a female friend of Sarah's lives in the bottom half. It should be noted that the lower portion of this residence is not visible from the street view. In attempt to gain further information on how entry is made to the lower portion of the residence, Det. Musselwhite, Det. Heffernan and I conducted more surveillance on the Baymont address. I saw a female, whom I believe is Malika (based on description) walking from the rear of the residence along the south end of the carport. She



 entered the trunk of a silver car parked at the end of the street near the house. She returned to the house they way she came.

I am seeking the ability to search only the lower portion of the residence located at 2503 Baymont Plc.

Therefore, I request authority to search for and seize the following items;

Denton used a van registered to her under the name Tarra Denton on a few of these occasions. I was on surveillance during four buys that were arranged with Denton. I visually observed Denton arriving and leaving from the deal locations during buy #1 and #4.

The operative was followed away from the controlled buys and met at a post-buy secure location. I met with the operative and at least one other detective, after the buys

I put the purchased evidence into the BPD evidence room after each buy. I was able to confirm that the purchases drugs from buys #1 and 4 were schedule 2 drugs. This was determined by their appearance and the use of a pill identifier. They were specifically indentified as Oxycodone Hydrochloride.


I located and arrested Denton at about 1658 hrs today while serving a warrant on Baymont Place in Bremerton WA. She was arrested on the probable cause detailed above and advised of her rights. I was contacted by Ofc. Rauback who had transported Denton to the jail. He advised that Denton swallowed evidence when she had the opportunity during a more intimate search of her by female jail staff.
